



FACTS AND FIGURES FALL 1999

In the spring of 1997, the college canceled classes and convened all of its administrators, faculty, and students for a day-long discussion designed to identify what it means to be a responsible member of our community. By coincidence, though an ironic one, the day we gathered marked the fifth anniversary of the racial incident that had been the catalyst for so much change at Olivet.

Since attendance wasn't required, only those who *wanted* to be there and contribute were there. Faculty, administration, and students, along with some trustees, all sat at small round tables in mixed groups in the gym. There were pads and pencils there for brainstorming. Each group was to work together and come up with their best ideas, which they would present to the whole gathering. Most groups filled several notepads with ideas. As each group explained their ideas to the body, everything was captured on large flip chart paper. The sheets were then put up on the walls, and later everyone walked around the gym with little Post-it notes and added their own ideas and insights to those already there. Here was a college community in which all stakeholders were developing standards of behavior, responsibility, and discipline! Students were amazed that they were actually taking part and having a say. They responded enthusiastically, adding their considerable energies.

After the gathering, all the large sheets of paper that included the Post-it note ideas were displayed in the main hall so everyone in the college community--especially those who had not participated in the meeting--could see the ideas and give their input.

The set of principles that resulted from that gathering and from several weeks of refinements is now known as the Olivet College Compact. It is given to each student upon admission to the college, and it has become a sort of guiding constitution for the college and all who study and work there.

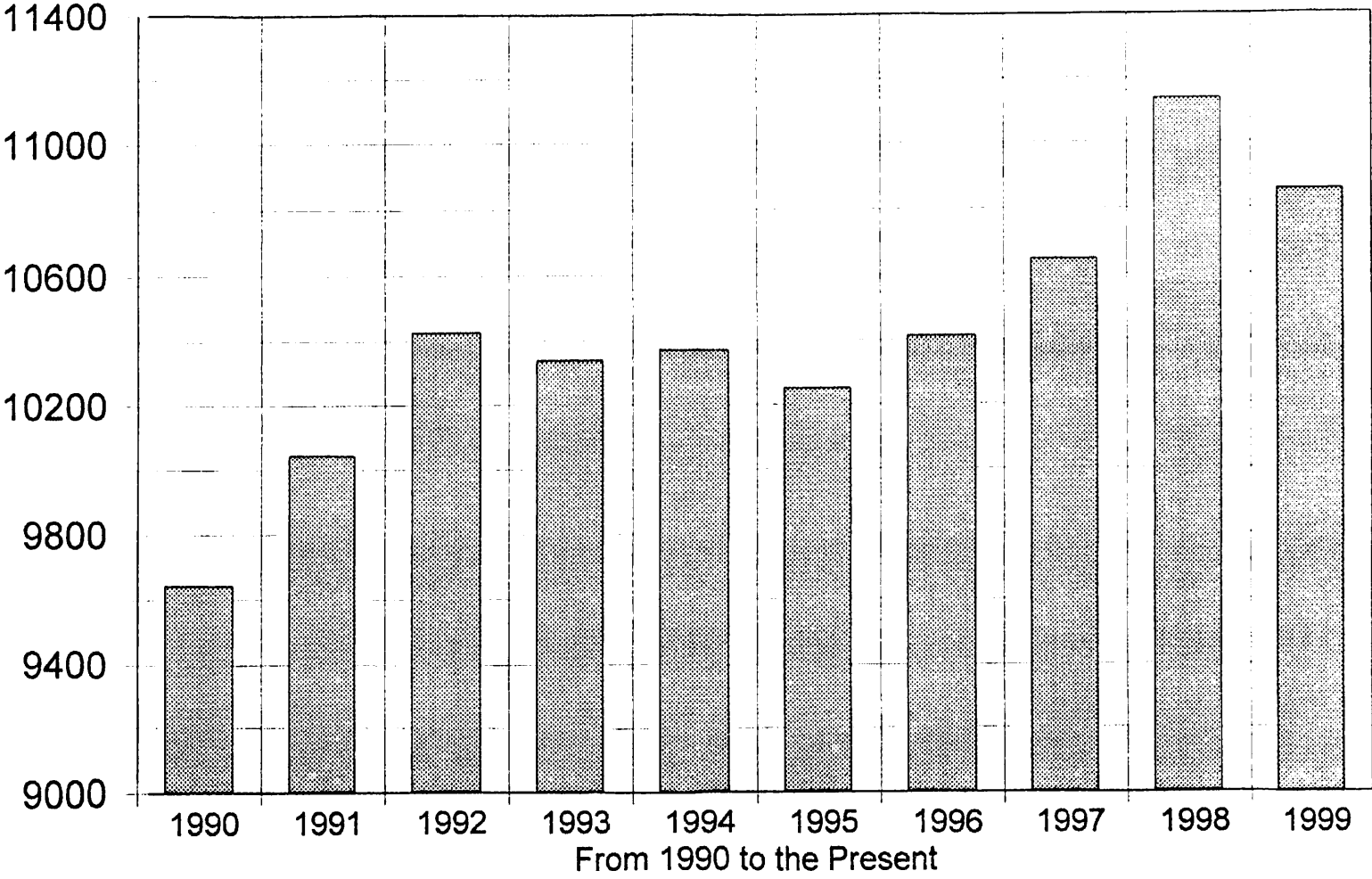

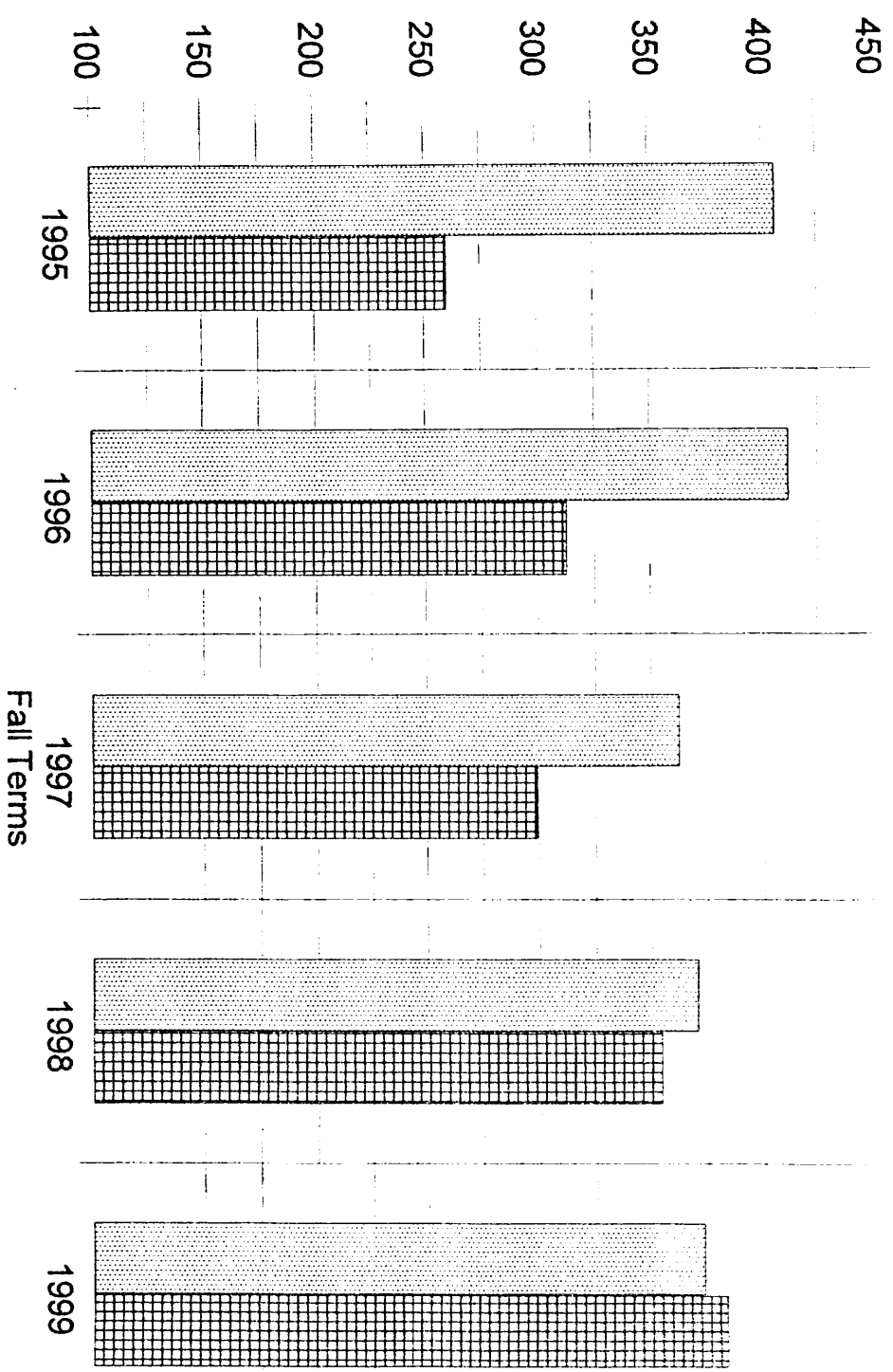

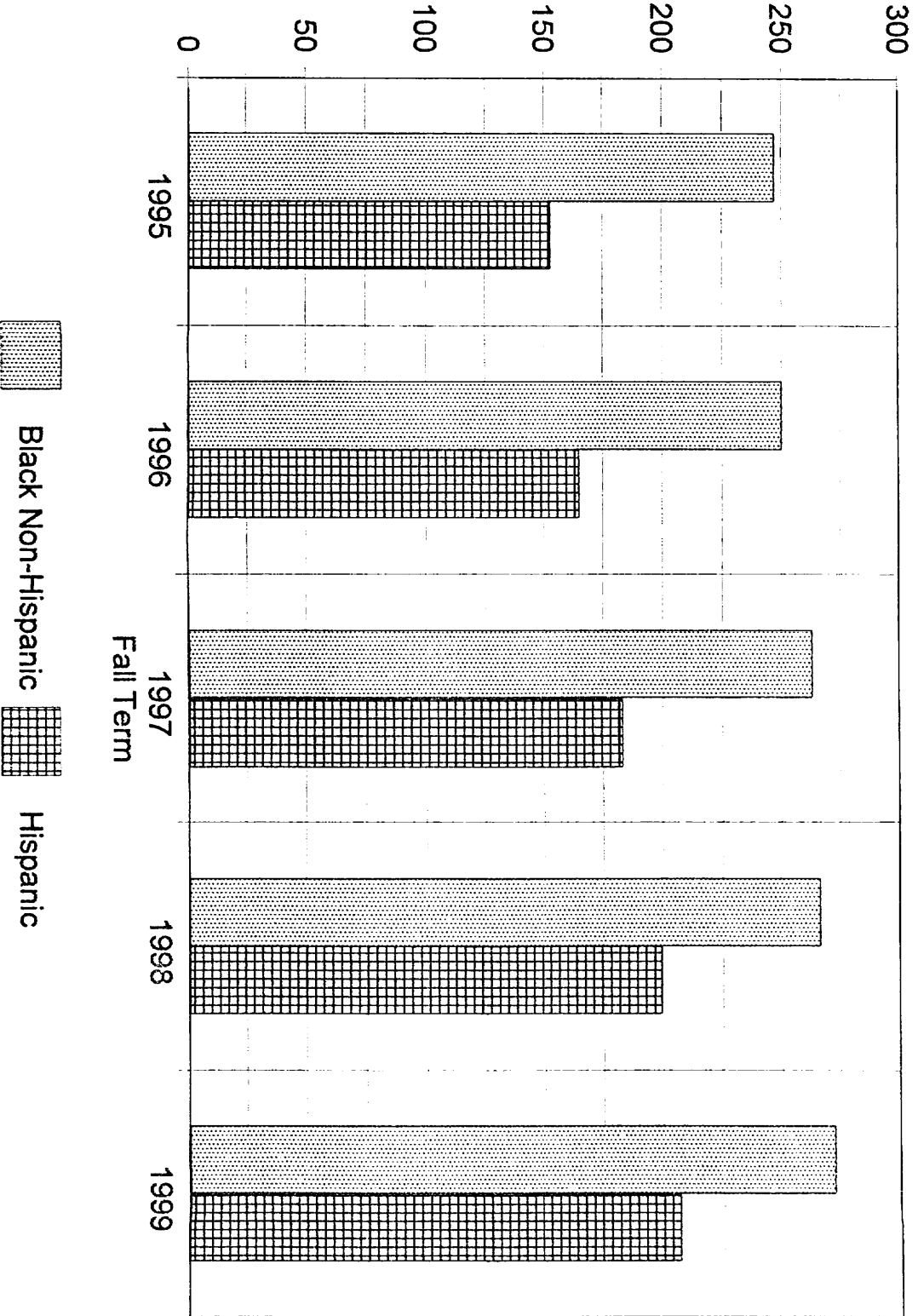

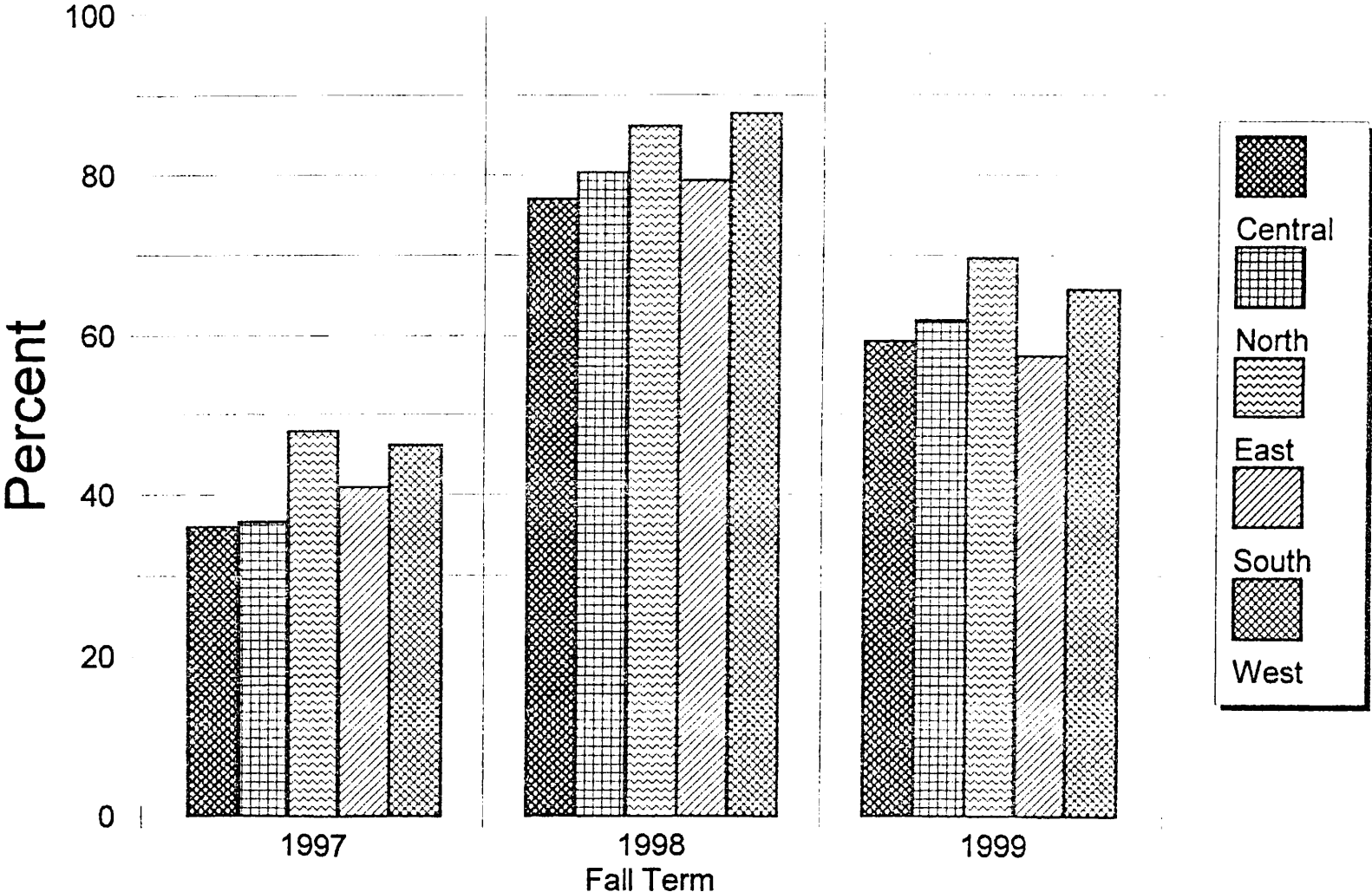
