## Highlights

Non-credit enrollments tend to have an aspect of meeting an immediate need or interest; credit course enrollments tend to have an aspect of meeting a longer term need.

The college has been averaging over 15,000 non-credit duplicated enrollments each year. Unduplicated headcounts were approximately 12,000 in Fiscal Year 1996 with over 9,000 enrolled in business assistance training workshops and learning experiences.

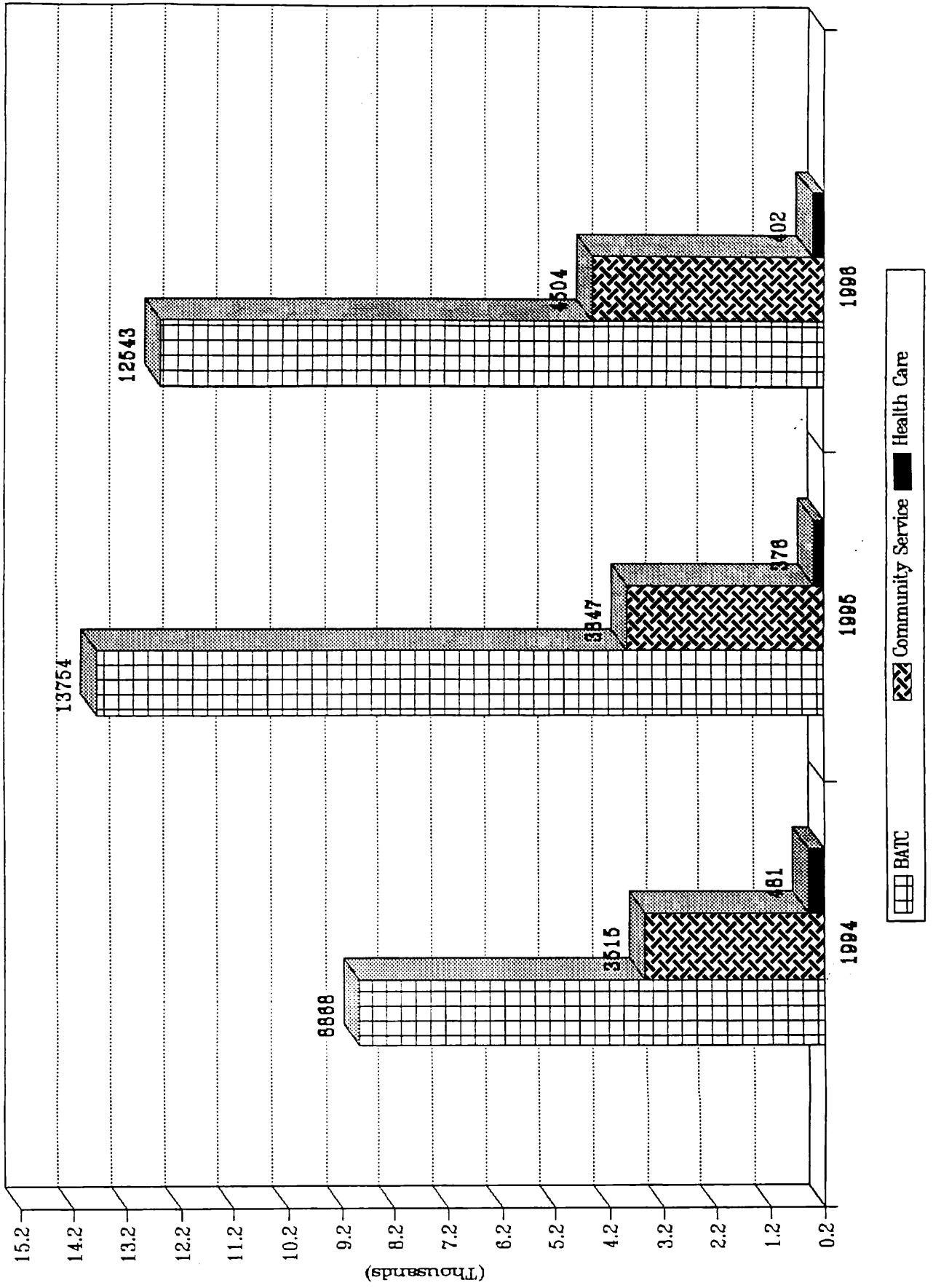
Men dominated the enrollments in business assistance training, 8 to 1. In all other areas, females held the edge. Enrollments were primarily off-campus for business assistance training and youth college experiences, while health care and community service programming were mainly on-campus activities. A significant number of the business assistance training enrollees were from out-of-district. The average age of those enrolled in business assistance training was 39.5; community service was 45.4; youth college, 9.9 and health care, 34.6.

NOTE: the 1997 figures are preliminary; enrollment data for Spring 1997 was incomplete as of the beginning of April 1997. An update of this report will be available in August 1997.
