Spring 2011 Census Report

Headcount/Credit Hours

The unduplicated Spring 2011 headcount is 16,379, up 1.5% from last Spring (+239 students). This is not only the largest Spring census headcount in JJC's history, it is the highest unduplicated census headcount for any term. Credit hours for Spring 2011 are down 0.5% from last Spring (-679.5 credit hours). The number of students enrolling in at least one web-based course (excludes blended course sections) has increased from 2,467 students for the Spring 2010 census to 2,838 students in Spring 2011 (+15.0%).

Enrollment by Full-Time/Part-Time Status

Part-time students represent 68.4% of the Spring 2011 census headcount, this is a 5.4% increase (+574 part-time students) from Spring 2010. JJC witnessed a 6.1% decrease to the number of full-time students for Spring 2011 (5,180 full-time students), this is a decrease of 335 full-time students from the Spring 2010 census of 5,515 full-time students.

Enrollment by Gender and Ethnicity

The number of female credit students has increased by 2.1% (+192 females) from the previous Spring term. Females make up 56.3% of the Spring 2011 census headcount; this represents a 0.3% increase from the 56.0% represented in 2010.

The minority population at JJC represents 34.0% of the total census headcount for Spring 2011. For the Spring 2011 census Black Non-Hispanic students witnessed an increase of 24.2% (+374 students) from the previous Spring census, while the Hispanic population has seen a 40.4% increase for Spring 2011 (+895 students), and the White Non-Hispanic student population has increased by 10.9% (+1,008 students) over the last Spring census. The total minority population for the Spring 2011 census is 5,569 – up 33.1% from the prior year's census. *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.*

Enrollment by Age

Just over thirty-nine percent (39.2%) of the Spring 2011 credit students are 25 years of age or older representing a 0.8% increase from 38.4% at the 2010 Spring census for the 25 and older population. The largest number change is represented by the 25-30 age category with an increase of 165 students (+8.4%). The overall average age of credit students at JJC for Spring 2011 is 26.5 years of age. The overall average age increased by 0.1 years for the previous Spring census of 26.4 years. *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.*

Enrollment by Registration Status

The number of continuing students has increased by 253 students (+2.4%) from the previous Spring term. JJC has witnessed a 2.4% decrease to the number of returning students (-69). Data definitions: New Freshman – a student not previously enrolled in college; New Pre-College – includes early entry and dual credit; Transfer – a student entering JJC having earned credit at another college/university; Continuing – a student who has enrolled at JJC the previous term; Returning – a student who has enrolled at JJC previously but not in the previous term. *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.*
