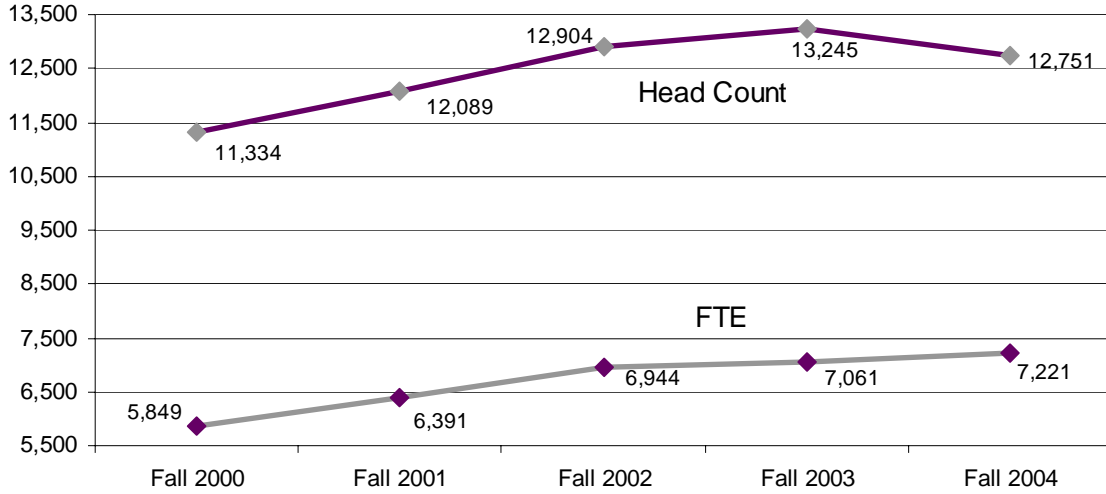

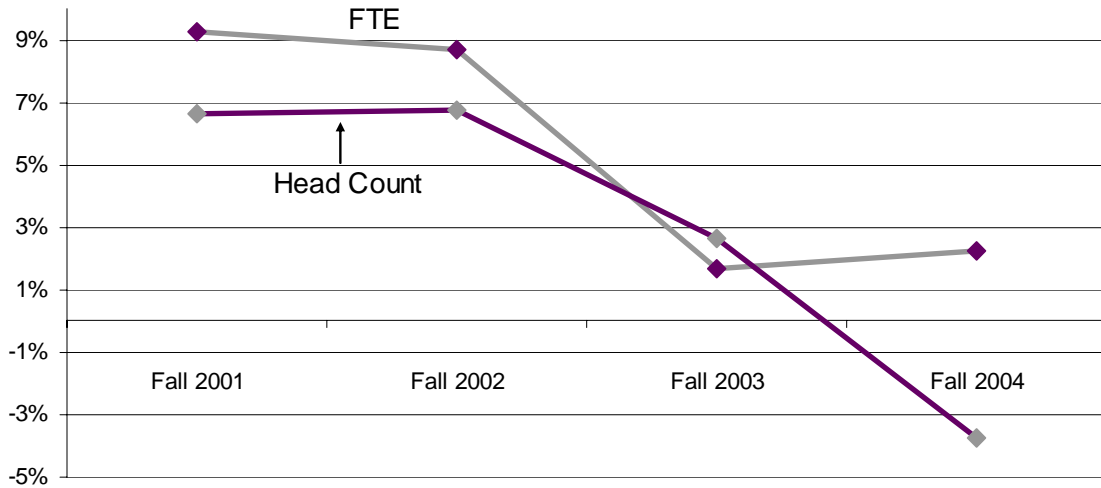

Joliet Junior College Enrollment Trends

Enrollment at Joliet Junior College, Fall 2000-Fall 2004

Note: Head Count Enrollment refers to number of students enrolled. FTE stands for Full-time Equivalent. It is a measure of the number of credit hours JJC offers and is calculated by taking the total number of credit hours and dividing it by what a normal full-time student is assumed to enroll in (15).

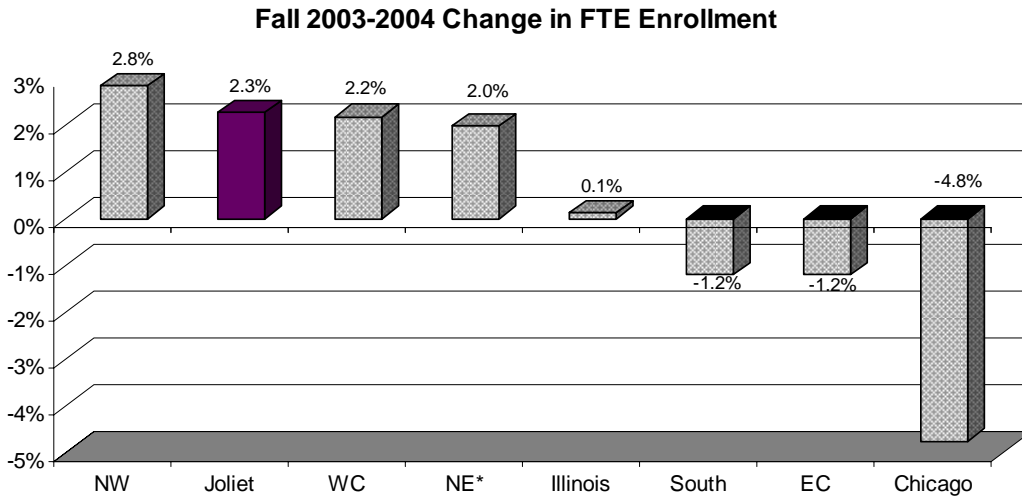

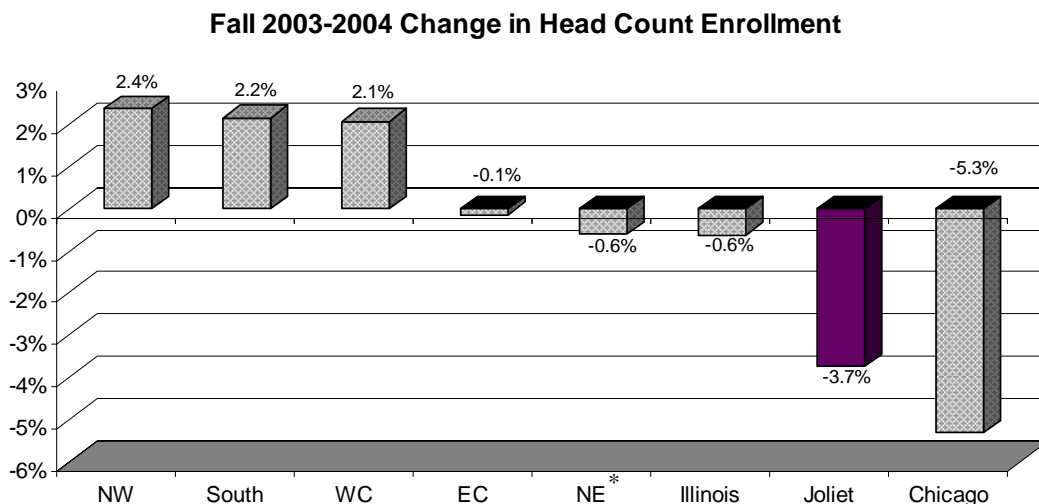
Fall 2003-Fall 2004 Changes in Enrollment

At 2.3%, JJC witnessed the 17th largest increase in FTE enrollment between Fall 2003 and Fall 2004 in the State of Illinois. The increase was larger than for any other region in the state except for community colleges in Northwestern Illinois.

23 community colleges witnessed decreases in head count enrollment between Fall 2003 and Fall 2004. Joliet witnessed a -3.7% decrease in head count enrollment compared to -0.6% for other community colleges in Northeast Illinois (not including Chicago) and -0.6% for all community colleges in Illinois. This suggests that more full-time students are enrolling at community colleges in Illinois.

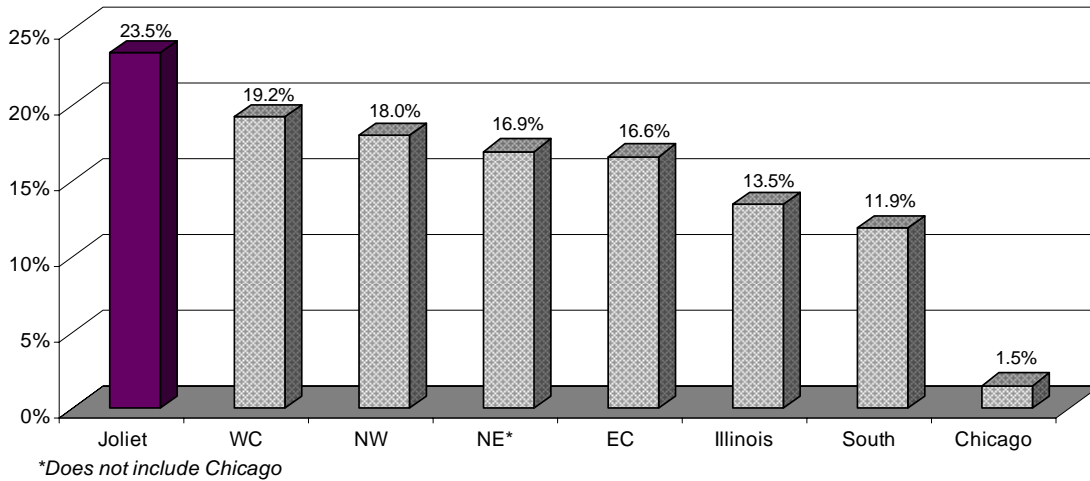

Five Year Trends: Fall 2000-Fall 2004

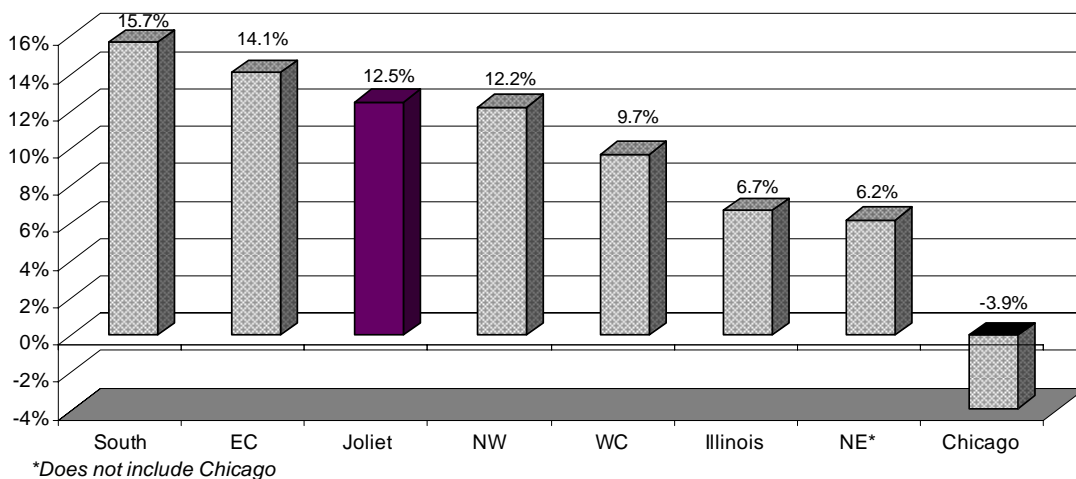
JJC's 23.5% increase in FTE enrollment over the last five years is the 8th highest in the state and well above other community colleges in northeastern Illinois.

Fall 2000-Fall 2004 Percent Change in FTE Enrollment



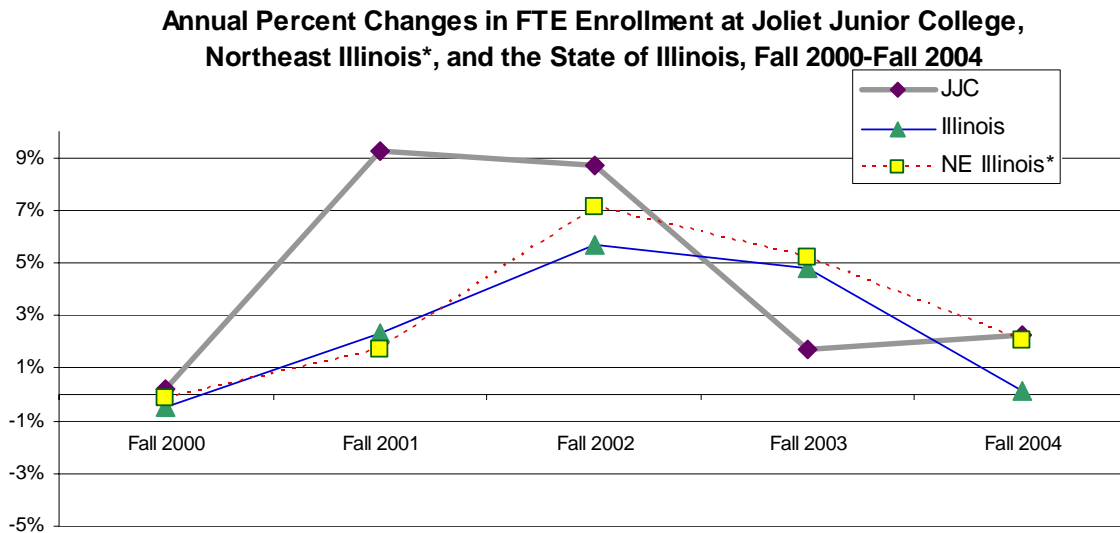
JJC's 12.5% increase in head count enrollment over the last 5 years has been the 15th highest in the state and more than doubles the increase for all community colleges in Illinois and in Northeastern Illinois.

Fall 2000-Fall 2004 Percent Change in Head Count Enrollment



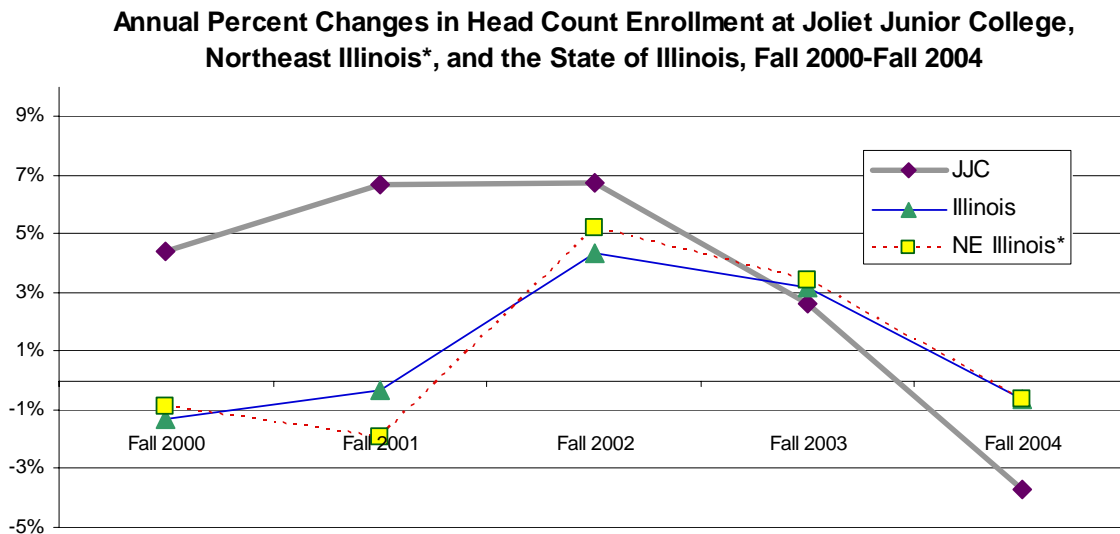
Southern Illinois is the only region in the state where head count enrollment is increasing at a faster rate than FTE enrollment.

With the exception of Fall 2003, FTE enrollment has increased at the same or faster rate at JJC than other community colleges in Illinois.

After growing at a faster rate than other community colleges in Northeast Illinois and the rest of the state in head count enrollment for several years, JJC began to witness slower growth in Fall 2003.

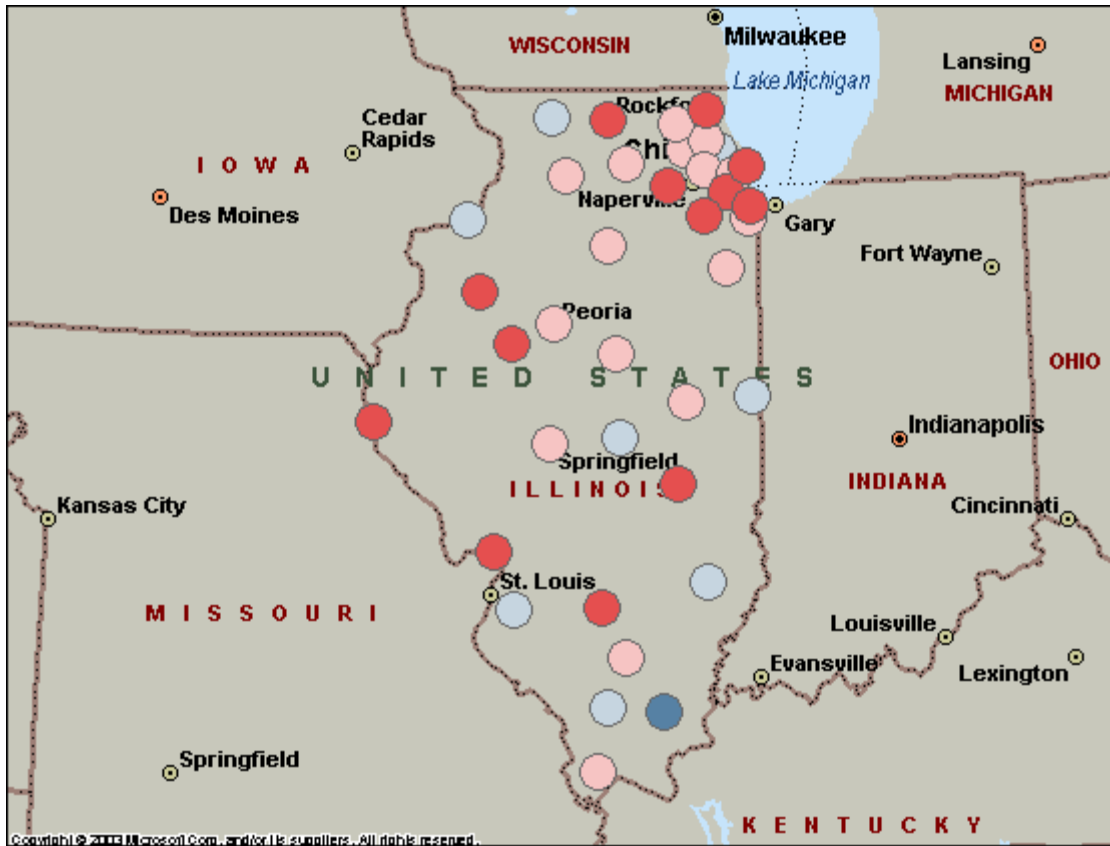

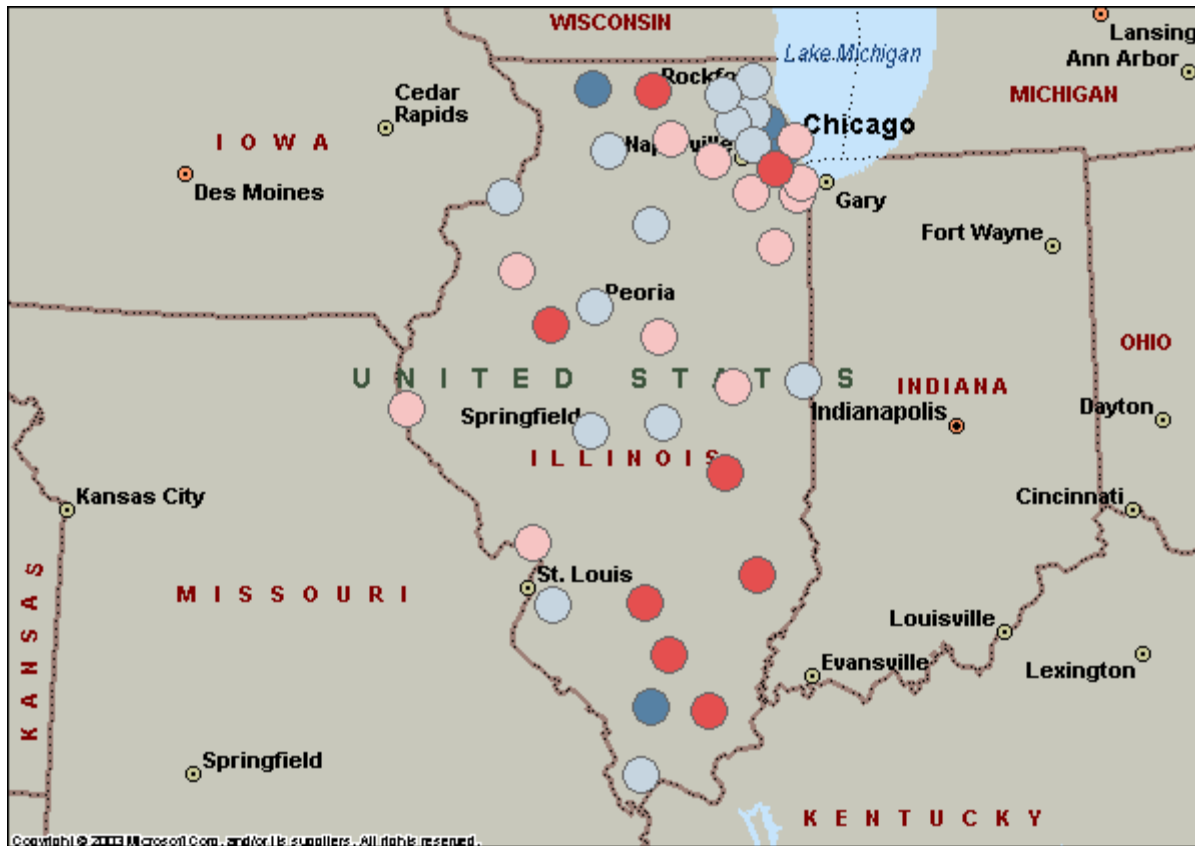
Percent Change in FTE Enrollment, Fall 2000-Fall 2004
