



# Cohort Graduation Rates at Illinois Community Colleges and Joliet Junior College, 1999-2002

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## Method

This study looked at the graduation rates from students in a cohort at Joliet Junior College and compared them to rates at other Illinois community colleges.

For the purposes of this study, a cohort was defined as first-time, first-year degree seeking students only.

Once identified, students in the cohort were followed for three years. Hence, if a student received a degree three years after initially enrolling, they were identified as graduating within 150% of normal time.

Data was gathered from the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS). All colleges and universities are federally mandated to submit data to IPEDS. For more information, visit the IPEDS website at: <http://nces.ed.gov/ipeds/>

## About Using Graduation Rates

Several technical issues arise when looking at graduation rates in community colleges:

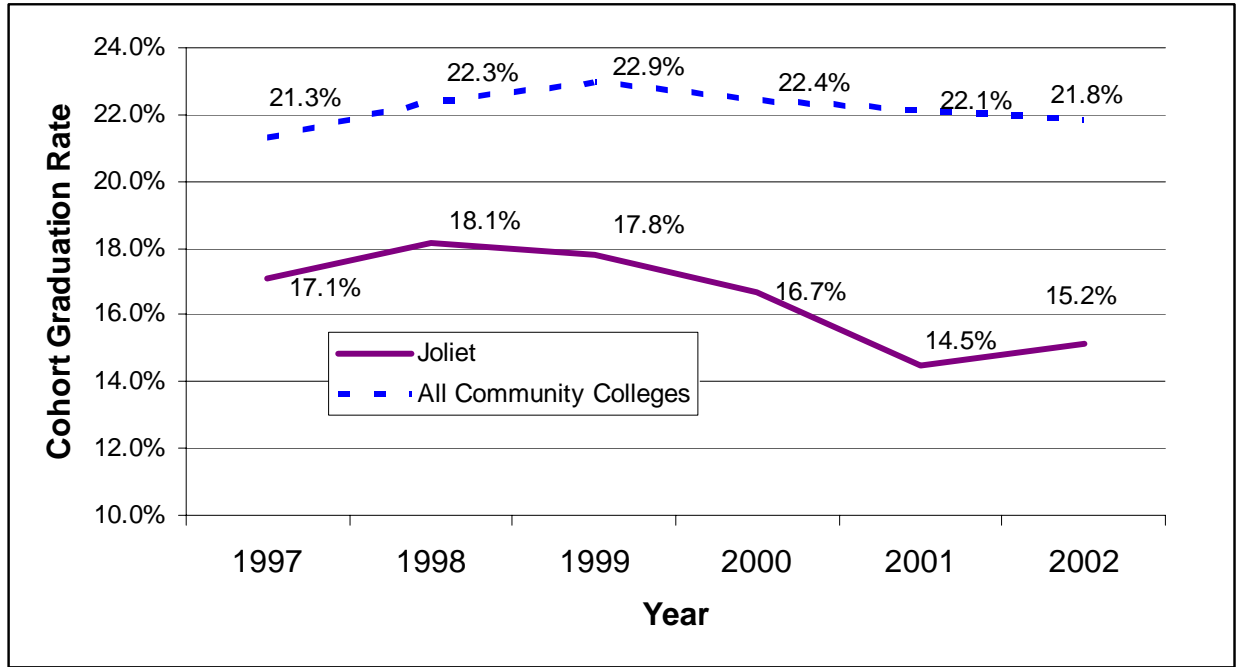
*Community college students are generally more goal oriented as opposed to degree oriented.* For instance, a student may initially enroll at a community college with the intent of transferring to a four-year institution and complete the appropriate number of courses required for graduation without actually graduating.

*Research using cohorts are dependent on institutional definitions, histories, and organizational structures.* This study looks at students who graduate within 150% of normal time, or 3 years. Students at some institutions, however, may take longer to graduate. Other colleges might be located in a district with that places more value on degree attainment or transfer rates rather than occupational or career outcomes.

*Graduation rates should not be used as a proxy for learning outcomes.*

### Percent of First-time, First-year Degree Seeking Students who Graduate within 3 years of Initially Enrolling

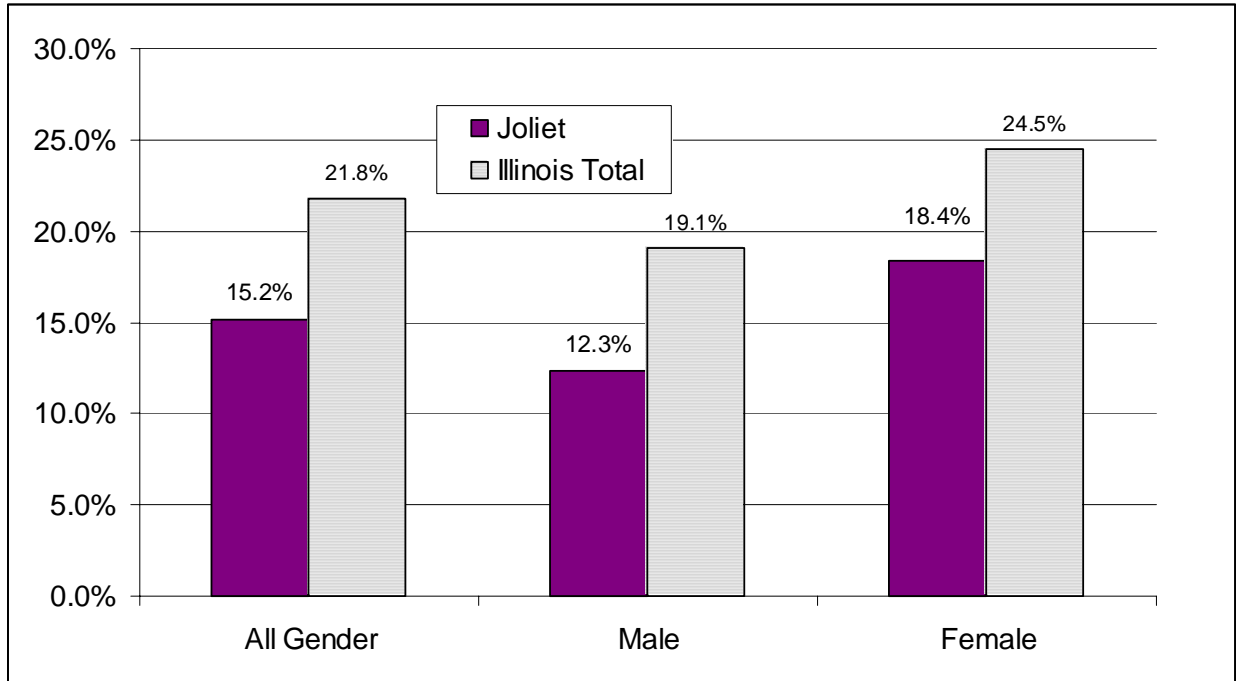


### Percent of First-time, First-year Degree Seeking Students who Graduate within 3 years of Initially Enrolling at Joliet Junior College

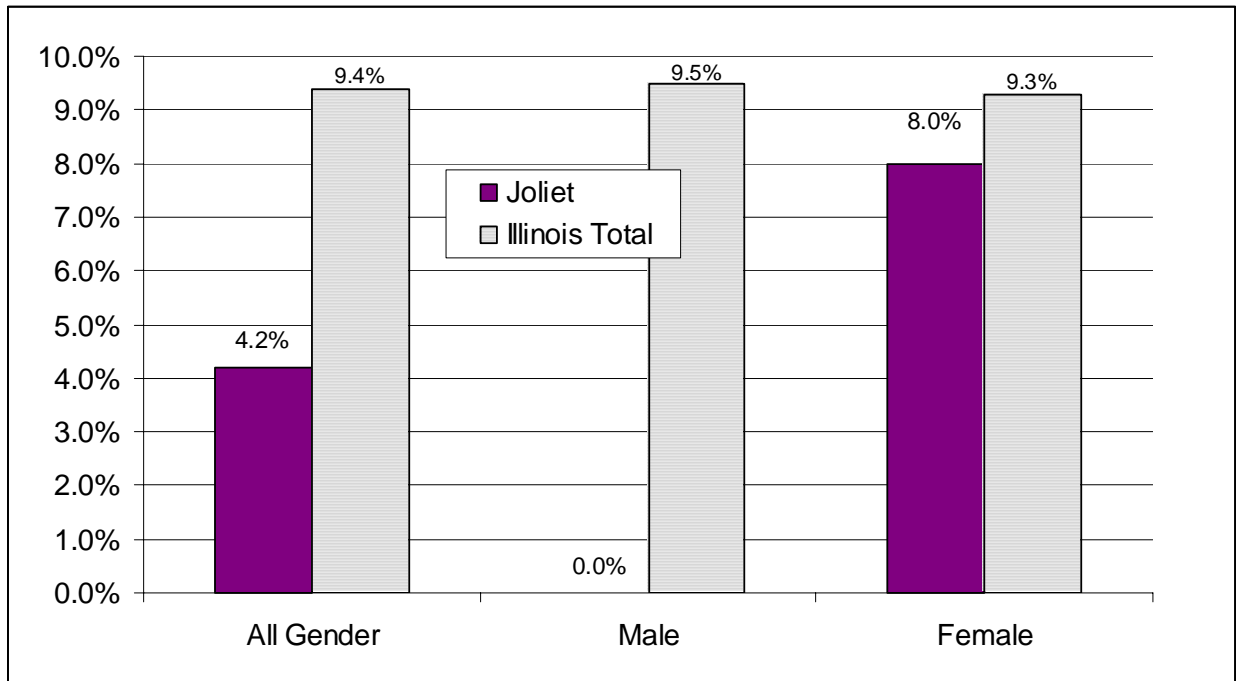

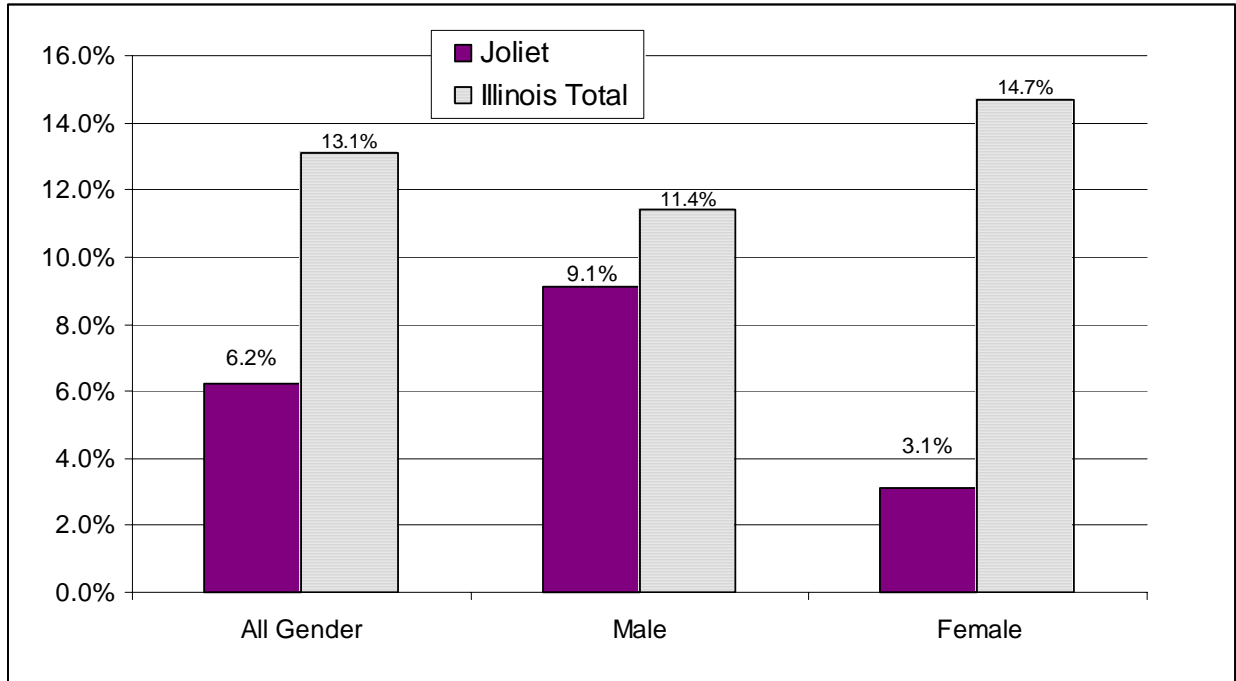
**Percent of 1996 Joliet Junior College and Illinois Cohort Students who Graduated by 1999 by Gender**



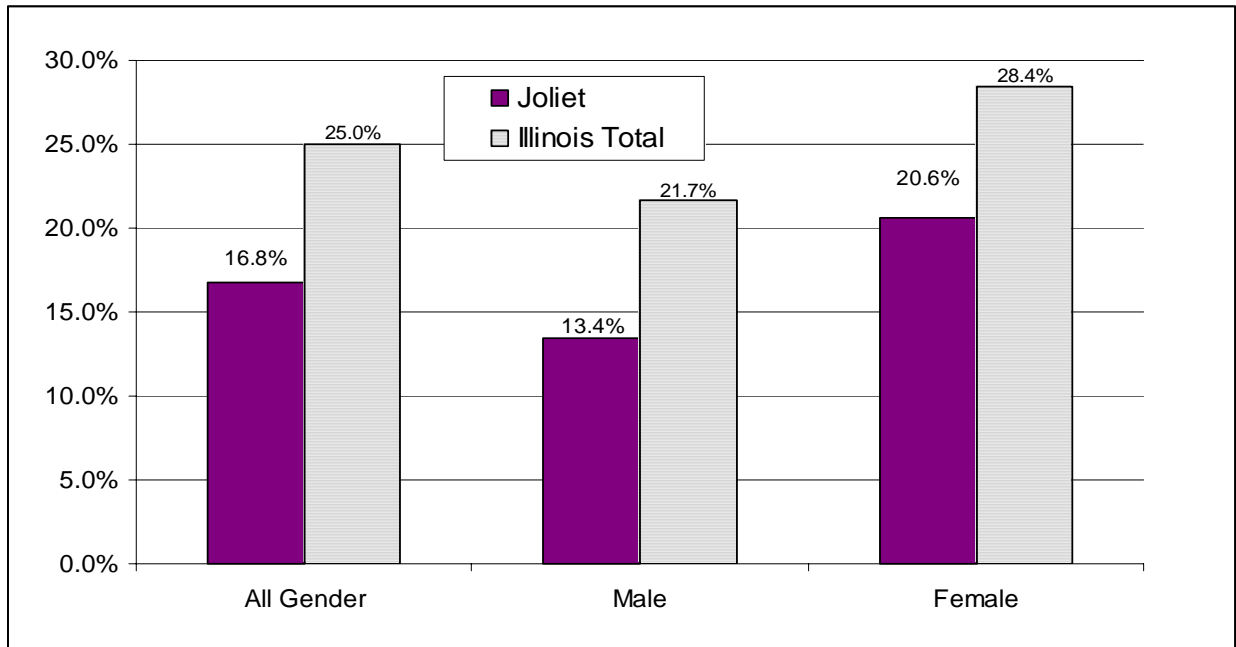
**Percent of 1996 Joliet Junior College African-American and Illinois Cohort Students who Graduated by 1999 by Gender**

Cohort: refers to the number for first-time, first-year degree seeking students in a given fall semester

150%: the number of students in the cohort who graduate in "150%" time, or 3 years

Rate: the graduation rate for the cohort. Calculated as cohort/150%
