Fall 2010 Fall Census Briefing

Headcount/Credit Hours

The Fall 2010 census headcount is 15,676, up 2.5% from last Fall (+388 students). Credit hours for Fall 2010 are up 4.1% from last Fall (+5,771.0 credit hours). The number of students enrolling in at least one web-based course has increased from 2,109 students for the Fall 2009 census to 2,651 students in Fall 2010 (+25.7%).

Enrollment by Full-Time/Part-Time Status

Part-time students represent 56.2% of the Fall 2010 census headcount, this is a 2.2% increase (+190 part-time students) from Fall 2009. JJC witnessed a 3.0% increase to the number of full-time students for Fall 2010 (6,866 full-time students), this is an increase of 198 full-time students from the Fall 2009 census of 6,668 full-time students.

Enrollment by Gender and Ethnicity

The number of male credit students has increased by 2.1% (+141 males) from the previous Fall term. The overall percent of males compared to the Fall 2010 census total is 43.6%, this represents a +0.2 percentage point change from the 43.8% proportion of males represented in Fall 2009.

The minority population at JJC represents 32.8% of the total census headcount for Fall 2010, up in comparison from 27.4% at the Fall 2009 census. For the Fall 2010 census Black Non-Hispanic students witnessed an increase of 15.8% (+253 students) from the previous Fall census, while the Hispanic population has seen a 28.5% increase for Fall 2010 (+617 students), and the White Non-Hispanic student population has decreased by 2.0% (-201 students) over the last Fall census. *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.*

Enrollment by Age

Just over thirty-eight percent (38.2%) of the Fall 2010 credit students are 25 years of age or older representing a 0.4% increase from the 37.8% represented at the Fall 2009 census for this age category. The largest number change is the 21-24 age category with an increase of 196 students (+7.3%). The full-time and part-time average ages for Fall 2010 are 21.6 and 30.3 years respectively, resulting in an overall average age of 26.4 years. *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.*

Enrollment by Registration Status

The number of continuing students has increased by 763 students (+8.6%) from the previous Fall term. JJC has witnessed a 2.5% increase to the number of returning students (+73). Data definitions: New Freshman – A student not previously enrolled in college; New Pre-College – includes early entry and dual credit; Transfer – a student entering JJC having earned credit at another college/university; Continuing – A student who has enrolled at JJC the previous term (for Fall, the previous term includes spring or summer); Returning – a student who has enrolled at JJC previously but not in the previous term (for Fall term, the previous term includes spring or summer). *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.*

Enrollment by Top 25 Cities
