# RESIDENCY INFORMATION

- Nearly 33% of all community college students live with their parents. About 40% of JJC students state they live with their parents.
- In Fall 2005, about 13% of JJC students had a dependent child living with them, compared to about 21% of students at other community colleges.

Clearly, a majority of JJC students live with either a parent or on their own with a friend, relative, or sibling. This data would also seem to suggest that a minority of JJC students actually own their residences. The following table shows where students live based on national data and by sector.

## Students with Dependent Children

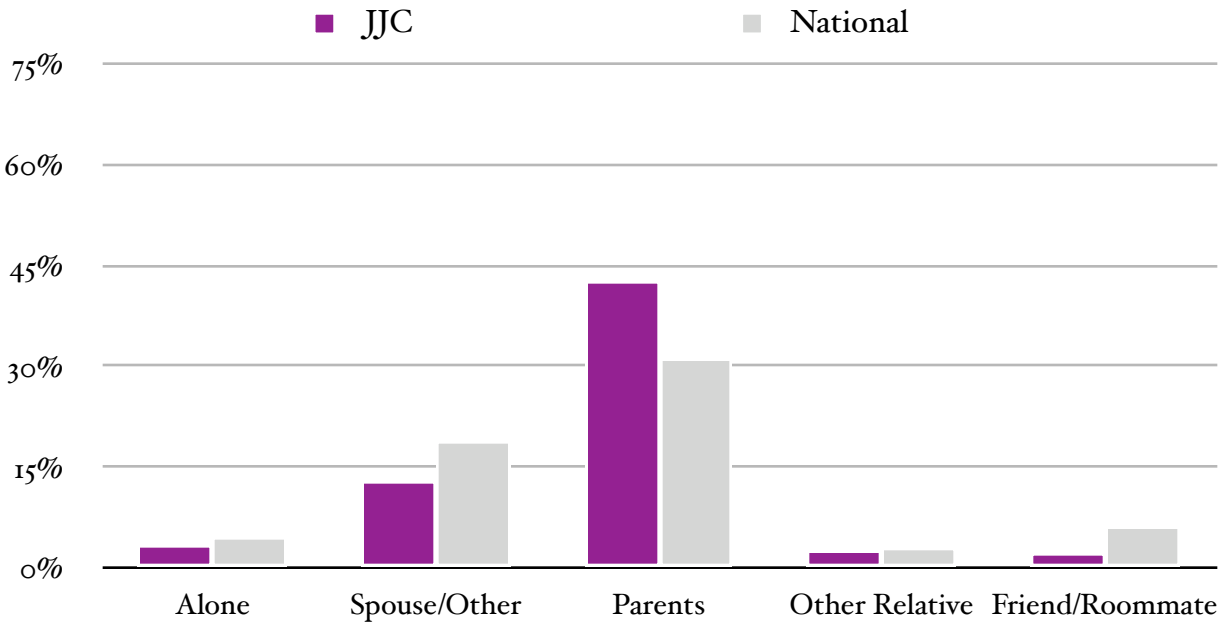
It is important to recognize the unique situations of students with dependent children. While community college students with children are just as likely to complete an Associate's, they are less likely to complete a Bachelor's Degree.<sup>2</sup>

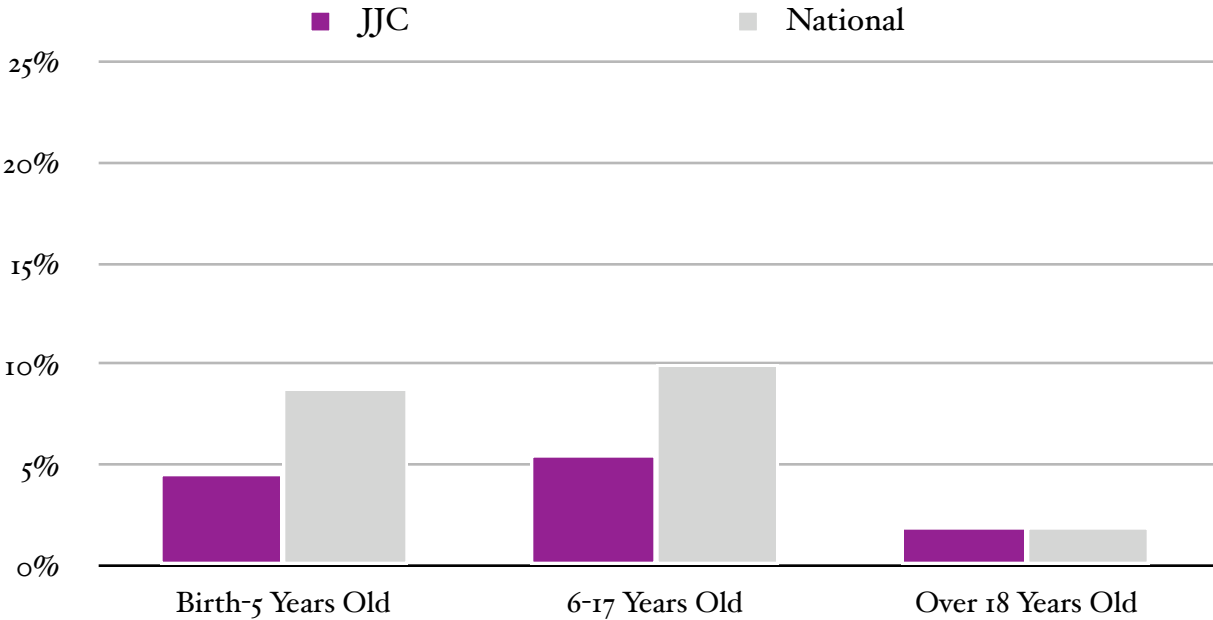
