#### Headcount and Full-time Equivalency (FTE) Enrollment

The unduplicated Fall 2014 census headcount is 15,776, down 6.5% from last Fall (-1,094 students). The number of students enrolling in at least one web-based course (excludes blended course sections) has decreased for the 2014 Fall term; on the 2013 Fall census 3,263 students enrolled in at least one web-based course compared to 2,989 at census for Fall 2014 representing a -8.4% change. Credit Hours have decreased by 6.4% from the previous Fall census (-9,248.0 credit hours), the 135,300.5 credit hours equates to a *Full-time Equivalency* (FTE\*) of 9,020 for the 2014 Fall census (-617 FTE).

Headcount and FTE enrollment trends are represented in figures *1.0-Headcount Enrollment at Joliet Junior College* and 2.0- Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Enrollment at Joliet Junior College on the following pages.





Figure 1.0-Headcount Enrollment at Joliet Junior College Fall Census 2010-2014

Figure 2.0-Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Enrollment at Joliet Junior College Fall Census 2010-2014




# Enrollment by Full-Time/Part-Time Status

Part-time students represent nearly sixty-five percent (64.7%) of the Fall 2014 census headcount, this represents a 7.3% decrease (-807 part-time students) from Fall 2013. JJC witnessed a 4.9% decrease to the number of full-time students for Fall 2014 (-287 full-time students).

Figure 3.0-Headcount Enrollment by Full/Part-time Status Fall Census 2010-2014




# Enrollment by Gender and Race/Ethnicity

The number of female credit students has decreased 5.7% (-514 females) from the previous Fall term census. Females make up 54.3%% of the Fall 2014 census headcount. Fewer males also enrolled for Fall 2014 down 7.4% (-580 students). Figure 4.0 below represents the enrollment trends by gender over the 5 most recent Fall terms.


During the Fall 2014 census Black Non-Hispanic students witnessed a decrease of 9.3% (-158 students) from the previous Fall census, the Hispanic population witnessed a 4.3% decrease or Fall 2014 (-162 students), and the White Non-Hispanic student population decreased by 7.5% (-778 students) over the prior Fall census. The total minority population for the Fall 2014 census is 5,584 – down 5.3% from the prior year's census. *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.* Table 1.0 below represents the change in headcount by race/ethnicity over the 5 most recent Fall terms. Overall the minority population represents 36.4% of the total census headcount for Fall 2014 at JJC. 
#### Figure 5.0-Minority Headcount Enrollment as a Percent of Overall Student Population

# Enrollment by Age

Twenty-seven percent (27.0%) of the Fall 2014 credit students are 25 years of age or older representing a 2.6% decrease from 29.6% represented at the 2013 Fall census for the 25 and older population. The largest number change is represented by the 25-30 age with a 264 students (-15.6%). *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.* Table 2.0 below represents the headcount enrollment by age category.

# Figure 6.0-Headcount Enrollment by Age Category Fall Census 2010-2014




#### **Enrollment by Registration Status**

The number of continuing students has decreased by 887 students (-9.7%) from the previous Fall term. JJC has witnessed a 14.4% decrease to the number of returning students (-412). A decrease of 22.7% (-506) was witnessed to new freshman. New Pre-College students witnessed a 34.3% increase in headcount from the prior year's census (+762 students). Transfer students decreased by 51 students representing a 12.4% decline. Data definitions: New Freshman – a student not previously enrolled in college; New Pre-College – includes early entry, dual credit, and ABE/ESL/GED; Transfer – a student entering JJC having earned credit at another college/university; Continuing – a student who has enrolled at JJC the previous term; Returning – a student who has enrolled at JJC previously but not in the previous term. *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.*




# Enrollment by Intent (Goal) and Certificate/Degree Objective


#### Figure 8.0-Headcount Enrollment by Intent Fall Census 2010-2014

The following figure represents the primary intent of the student as of the current Fall census. Almost fifty-three percent (52.7%) of students indicated they intend to transfer. Figure 8.0 reflects the headcount and percent breakdowns by intent/goal categories. On average about fifty percent (49.5%) of students indicated they have an intent to transfer. Figure 9.0 on the following pages represents the students' certificate and degree objective for attending JJC. On average just under seventy percent (68.9%) of enrollees objective is to complete an Associate Degree.

# Figure 9.0-Headcount Enrollment Certificate/Degree Objective Fall Census 2010-2014




#### **Enrollment by Top 25 Cities**
