## **Headcount and Full-time Equivalency (FTE) Enrollment**

The unduplicated Fall 2015 census headcount is 14,944, down 5.3% from last Fall (-832 students). The number of students enrolling in at least one web-based course (excludes blended course sections) has increased for the 2015 Fall term; on the 2014 Fall census 2,989 students enrolled in at least one web-based course compared to 3,130 at census for Fall 2015 representing a 4.7% increase. Credit Hours have decreased by 3.6% from the previous Fall census (-4,822.0 credit hours), the 130,477.5 credit hours equates to a *Full-time Equivalency* (FTE\*) of 8,699 for the 2015 Fall census (-321 FTE).

Headcount and FTE enrollment trends are represented in figures 1.0-Headcount Enrollment at Joliet Junior College and 2.0- Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Enrollment at Joliet Junior College on the following pages.

\*FTE is equal to the number of credits generated divided by 15.0


## **Enrollment by Full-Time/Part-Time Status**

Part-time students represented sixty-four percent (64.4%) of the Fall 2015 census headcount, this represents a 5.8% decrease (-597 part-time students) from Fall 2014. JJC witnessed a 4.2% decrease to the number of full-time students for Fall 2015 (-235 full-time students).

Figure 3.0 represents the breakouts by full and part-time students over the most recent 5 Fall census dates.

#### **Enrollment by Gender and Race/Ethnicity**




Figure 4.0-Headcount Enrollment Gender Fall Census 2011-2015

The number of female credit students has decreased 4.8% (-410 females) from the previous Fall term census. Females made up 54.6% of the Fall 2015 census headcount. Fewer males also enrolled for Fall 2015 down 5.9% (-422 students). Figure 4.0 below represents the enrollment trends by gender over the 5 most recent Fall terms.

During the Fall 2015 census Black Non-Hispanic students witnessed a decrease of 3.9% (-61 students) from the previous Fall census, the Hispanic population witnessed a 3.3% increase for Fall 2015 (+120 students), and the White Non-Hispanic student population decreased by 8.3% (-798 students) compared to the prior Fall census. The total minority population for the Fall 2015 census is 5,749 – up 0.2% from the prior year's census. *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.* Table 1.0 below represents the change in headcount by race/ethnicity over the 5 most recent Fall terms. Overall the minority population represents 38.5% of the total census headcount for Fall 2015 at JJC. The Hispanic population represented 24.7% of the total student headcount for the Fall 2015 census. Figure 5.0 on the following page represents the minority enrollment population as a percent of the overall student population on Fall census.

Figure 5.0-Minority Headcount Enrollment as a Percent of Overall Student Population Fall Census 2011-2015



# **Enrollment by Age**

Twenty-six percent (26.2%) of the Fall 2015 credit students are 25 years of age or older representing a 0.8% decrease from 27.0% represented on the 2014 Fall census for the 25 and older population. The largest number change is represented by the 16 & Under age category with a decrease of 273 students (-39.5%). *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts*. 


### **Enrollment by Registration Status**

The number of continuing students has decreased by 122 students (-1.5%) from the previous Fall term. JJC has witnessed a 1.8% increase to the number of returning students (+44 students). An increase of 21.4% (+21.4%) was witnessed to new freshman. New Pre-College students witnessed a 36.1% decrease in headcount from the prior year's census (-1,075 students). Transfer students decreased by 48 students representing a 13.3 % decline. Data definitions: New Freshman – a student not previously enrolled in college; New Pre-College – includes early entry, dual credit, and ABE/ESL/GED; Transfer – a student entering JJC having earned credit at another college/university; Continuing – a student who has enrolled at JJC the previous term; Returning – a student who has enrolled at JJC previously but not in the previous term. Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.

### Enrollment by Intent (Goal) and Certificate/Degree Objective





Figure 9.0-Headcount Enrollment Certificate/Degree Objective Fall Census 2011-2015

The following figure represents the primary intent of the student as of the current Fall census. Almost fifty-five percent (54.9%) of students indicated they intend to transfer. Figure 8.0 reflects the headcount and percent breakdowns by intent/goal categories. On average about fifty-one percent (51.0%) of students indicated they have an intent to transfer as indicated by the red dotted line. Figure 9.0 on the following page represents the students' certificate and degree objective for attending JJC, on average sixty-nine percent (69.0%) of those enrolled had an objective to complete an Associate Degree.
