You'll learn to identify rhythms and rhythm abnormalities and how cardiac medications affect an EKG. You'll also become familiar with recordkeeping, patient confidentiality and administrative tasks. Pharmacy Technician Training (MGT 5170)

Jobs in the healthcare industry are growing at a fast pace. As the population ages and demand increases for prescription medications, so will the demand for pharmaceutical services. A pharmacy technician is a pharmacy health care worker, who works under the supervision of a licensed pharmacist, performing tasks like entering prescriptions into a computer, verifying prescriptions, ordering medication and preparing medication inventories. Pharmacy technicians normally work in retail pharmacies or hospital pharmacies, but some work for health insurance companies, pharmaceutical wholesalers, nursing homes and the federal government. Students must be at least 18 years of age and have received a high school diploma or GED to take the certification exam. Includes textbooks and supplies.
