

Headcount and Full-time Equivalency (FTE) Enrollment

The unduplicated Spring 2014 census headcount is 16,375, down 7.5% from last Spring (-1,331 students). The number of students enrolling in at least one web-based course (excludes blended course sections) has remained flat in relation to growth for the 2014 Spring term; on the 2013 Spring census 3,259 students enrolled in at least one web-based course compared to 3,256 at census for Spring 2014 representing a -0.09% change. Credit Hours have decreased by 5.6% from the previous Spring census (-7,997.0 credit hours), the 134,430.0 credit hours equates to a *Full-time Equivalency* (FTE*) of 8,962 for the 2014 Spring census (-533 FTE).

Headcount and FTE enrollment trends are represented in figures 1.0-*Headcount Enrollment at Joliet Junior College* and 2.0- *Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Enrollment at Joliet Junior College* on the following pages.

**FTE is equal to the number of credits generated divided by 15.0*

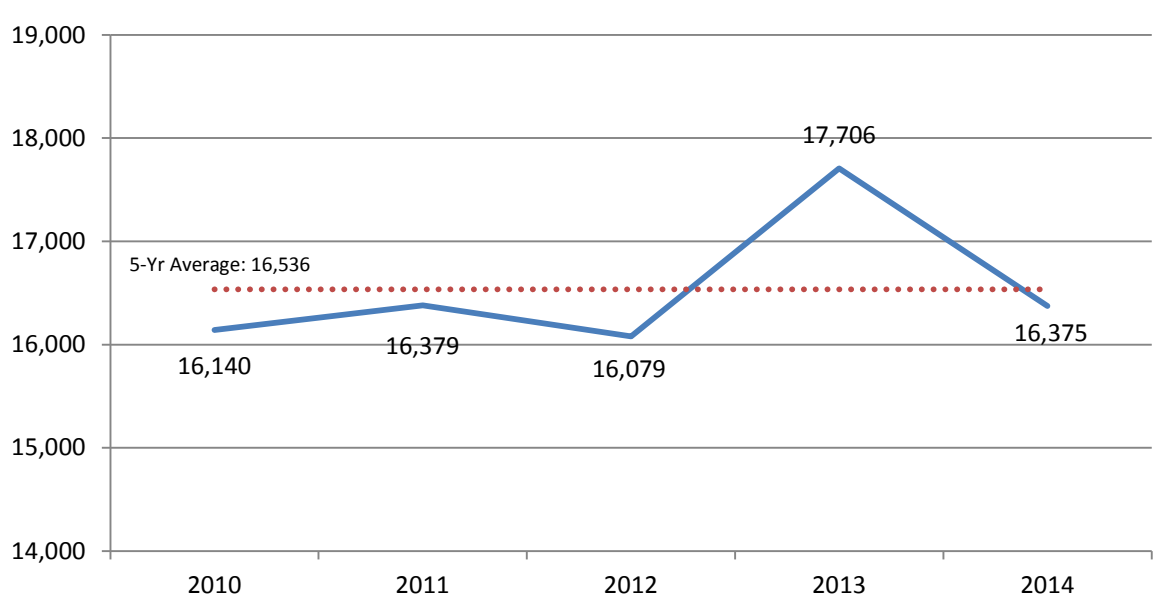
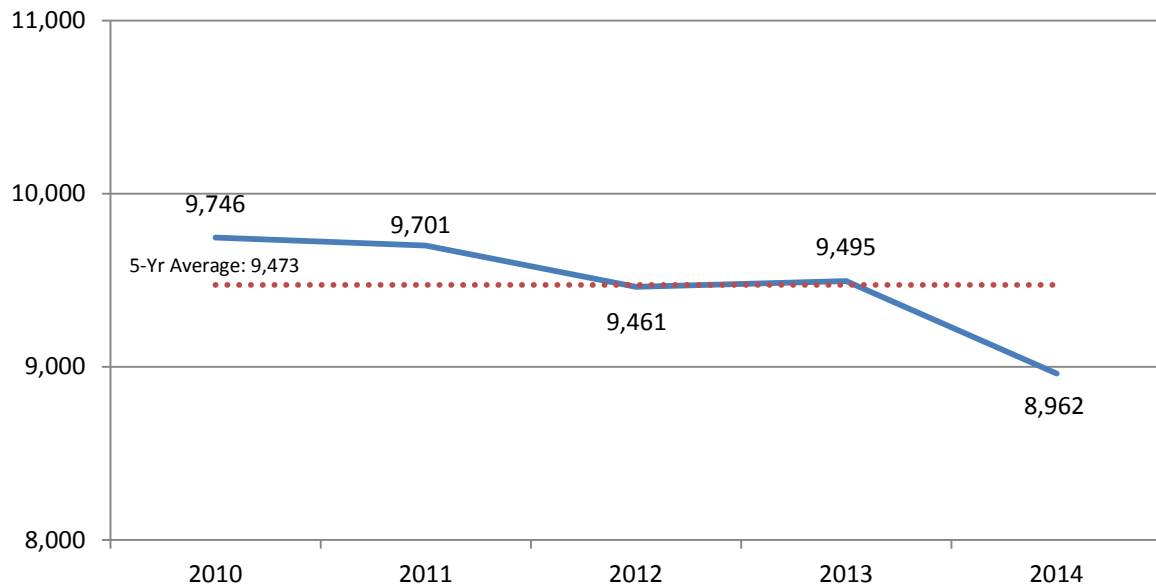


Figure 2.0-Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Enrollment at Joliet Junior College Spring Census 2010-2014

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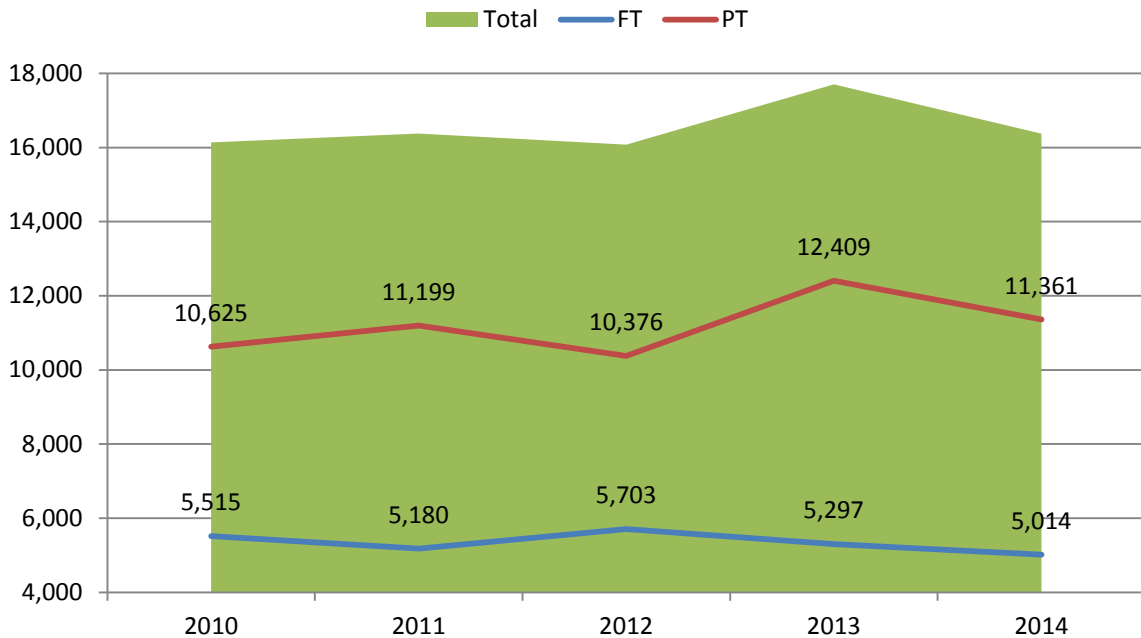
Enrollment by Full-Time/Part-Time Status

Part-time students represent nearly seventy percent (69.4%) of the Spring 2014 census headcount, this is a 8.4% decrease (-1,048 part-time students) from Spring 2013. JJC witnessed a 5.3% decrease to the number of full-time students for Spring 2014 (-283 full-time students).

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Enrollment by Gender and Race/Ethnicity

The number of female credit students has decreased 7.0% (-672 females) from the previous Spring term census. Females make up 54.9% of the Spring 2014 census headcount. Fewer males have also enrolled for Spring 2014 down 8.2% (-659 students). Figure 4.0 below represents the enrollment trends over the 5 most recent Spring terms.

During the Spring 2014 census Black Non-Hispanic students witnessed a decrease of 11.2% (-208 students) from the previous Spring census, the Hispanic population witnessed a 5.3% decrease for Spring 2014 (-201 students), and the White Non-Hispanic student population decreased by 7.4% (-817 students) over the prior Spring census. The total minority population for the Spring 2014 census is 5,786– down 7.2% from the prior year’s census. *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.* Table 1.0 below represents the change in headcount by race/ethnicity over the 5 most recent spring terms. Overall the minority population represents 35.3% of the total census headcount for Spring 2014 at JJC. Figure 5.0 on the following page represents the minority enrollment population as a percent of the overall student population on Spring census.

Figure 4.0-Headcount Enrollment Gender Spring Census 2010-2014

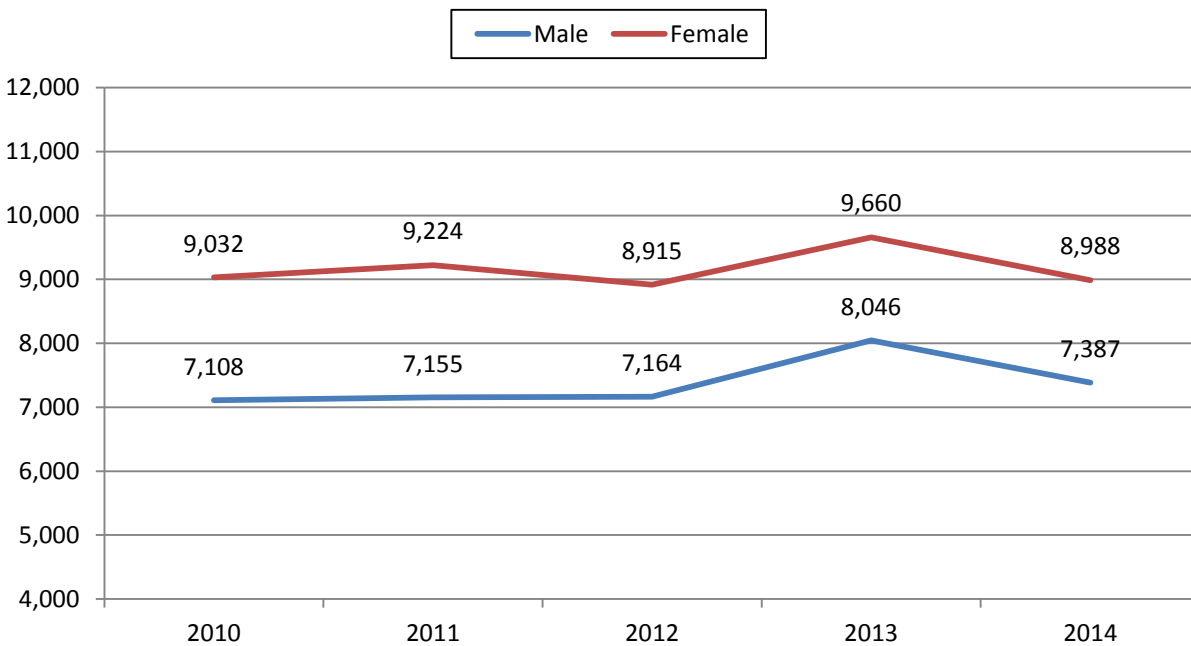
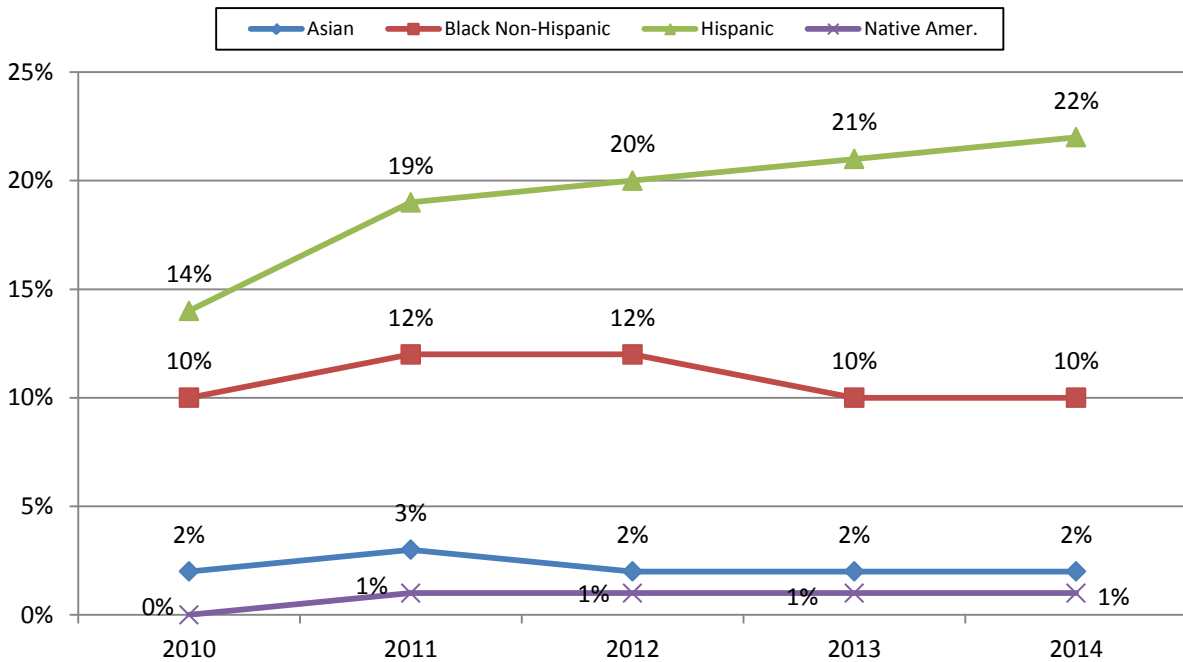
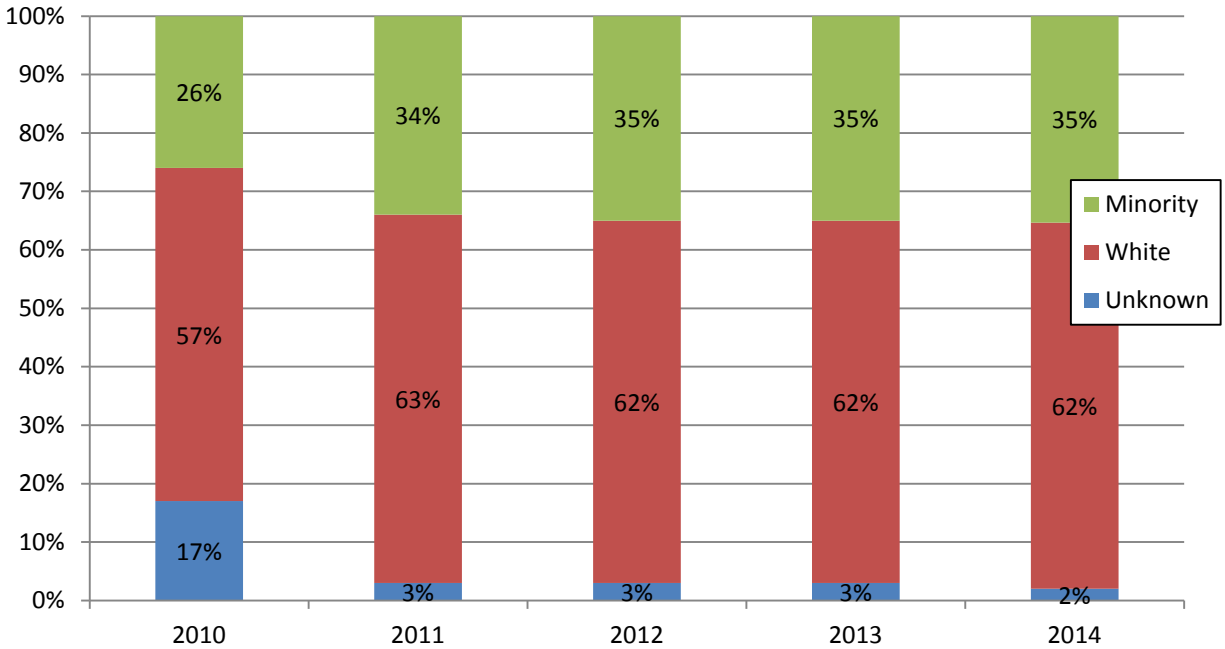

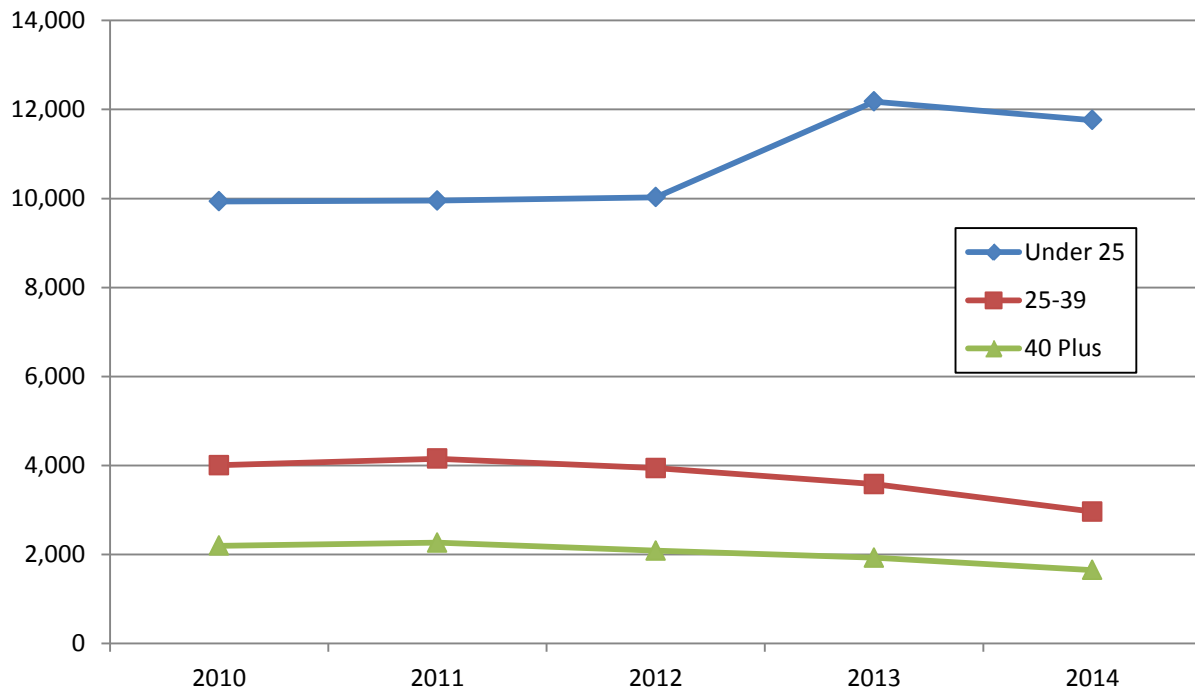
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Enrollment by Age

Just over twenty-eight percent (28.1%) of the Spring 2014 credit students are 25 years of age or older representing a 3.0% decrease from 31.1% represented at the 2013 Spring census for the 25 and older population. The largest number change is represented by the 16 & Under age category with a decrease of 748 students (-49.8%). *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.* Table 2.0 below represents the headcount enrollment by age category.

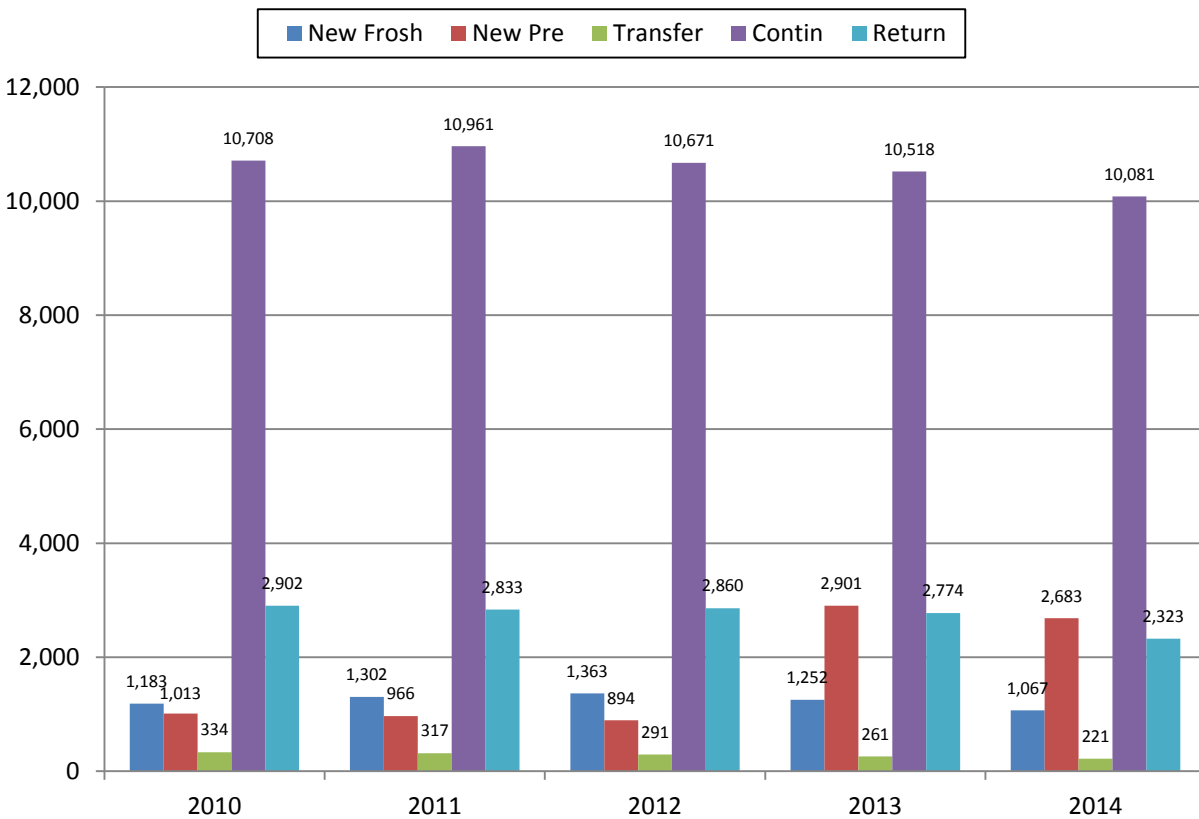


Enrollment by Registration Status

The number of continuing students has decreased by 437 students (-4.2%) from the previous Spring term. JJC has witnessed a 16.3% decrease to the number of returning students (-451). A decrease of 14.8% (-185) was witnessed to new freshman. New Pre-College students witnessed a 7.5% decrease from the prior year’s census (-218 students). Transfer students decreased by 40 students representing a 15.3% decline. Data definitions: New Freshman – a student not previously enrolled in college; New Pre-College – includes early entry, dual credit, and ABE/ESL/GED; Transfer – a student entering JJC having earned credit at another college/university; Continuing – a student who has enrolled at JJC the previous term; Returning – a student who has enrolled at JJC previously but not in the previous term. *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.*

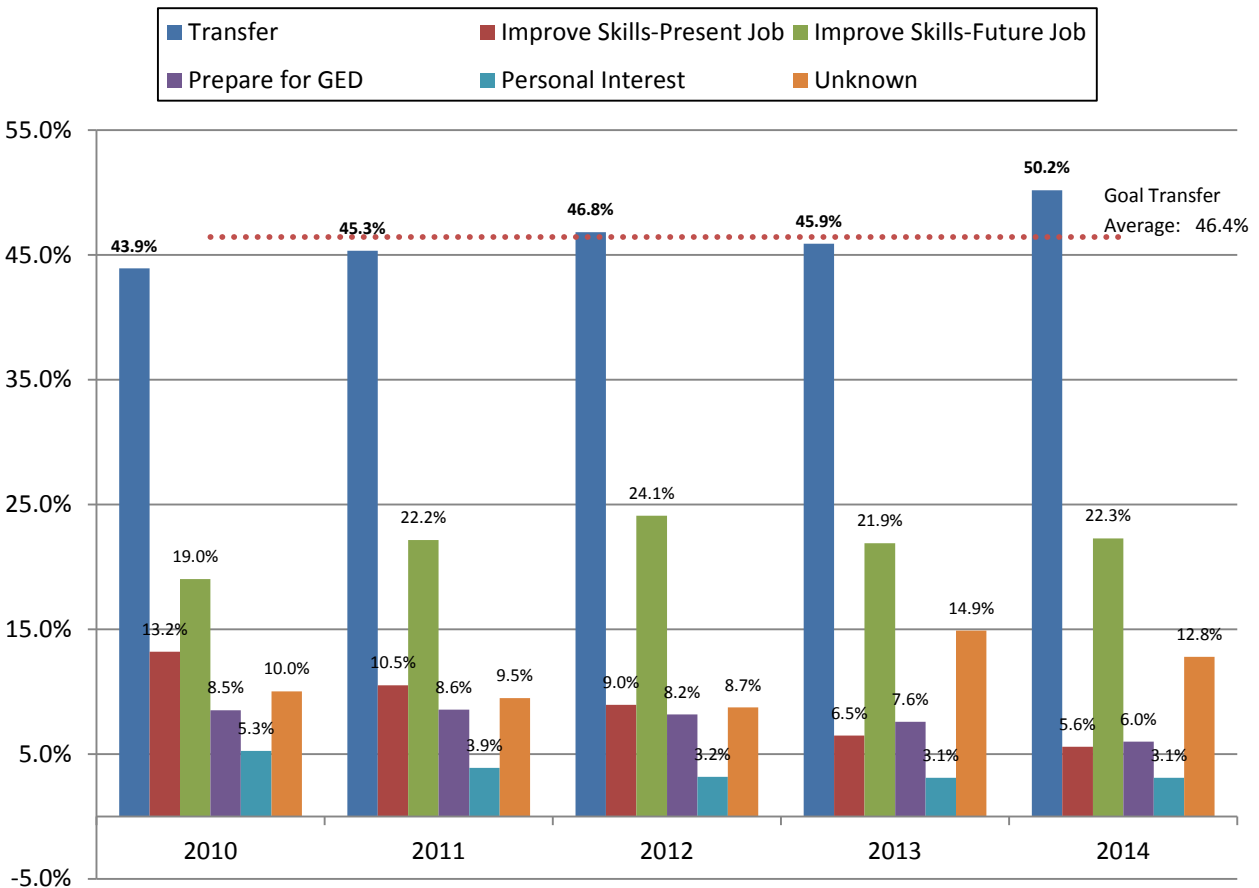
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Enrollment by Intent (Goal) and Certificate/Degree Objective

The following figure represents the primary goal of the student as of the current Spring census. More than fifty percent (50.2%) of students indicated they intend to transfer. This category is also the only area that witnessed an increase, up 1.0% over the previous Spring census (+82 students). Figure 8.0 reflects the headcount and percent breakdowns by intent/goal categories. Figure 9.0 on the following pages represents the students' certificate and degree objective for attending JJC. On average just under sixty-six (65.9%) of enrollees objective is to complete an Associate Degree.

Figure 8.0-Headcount Enrollment by Intent Spring Census 2010-2014

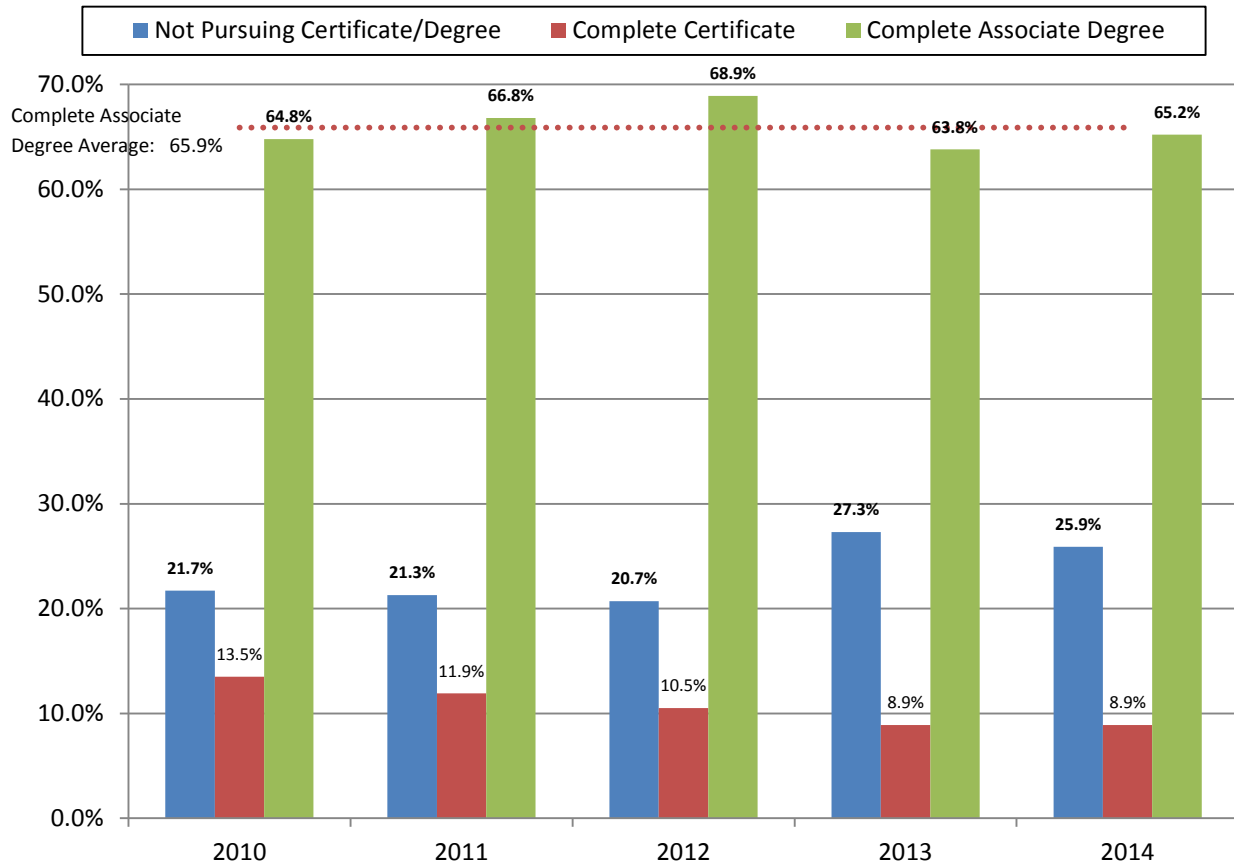
