

Headcount and Full-time Equivalency (FTE) Enrollment

The unduplicated Spring 2016 census headcount is 14,442 students, down 9.1% from last Spring (-1,446 students). The number of students enrolling in at least one web-based course (excludes blended course sections) has increased for the 2016 Spring census; on the 2015 Spring census 2,977 students enrolled in at least one web-based course compared to 3,140 at census for this Spring representing a 5.5% change to headcount (+163 students). Credit Hours overall have decreased by 7.1% from the previous Spring census (-9,195.0 credit hours), the 120,750.0 credit hours for the current census equates to a *Full-time Equivalency (FTE*)* of 8,050 (-613 FTE).

Headcount and FTE enrollment trends are represented in figures 1.0-*Headcount Enrollment at Joliet Junior College* and 2.0- *Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Enrollment at Joliet Junior College* on the following pages.

**FTE is equal to the number of credits generated divided by 15.0*

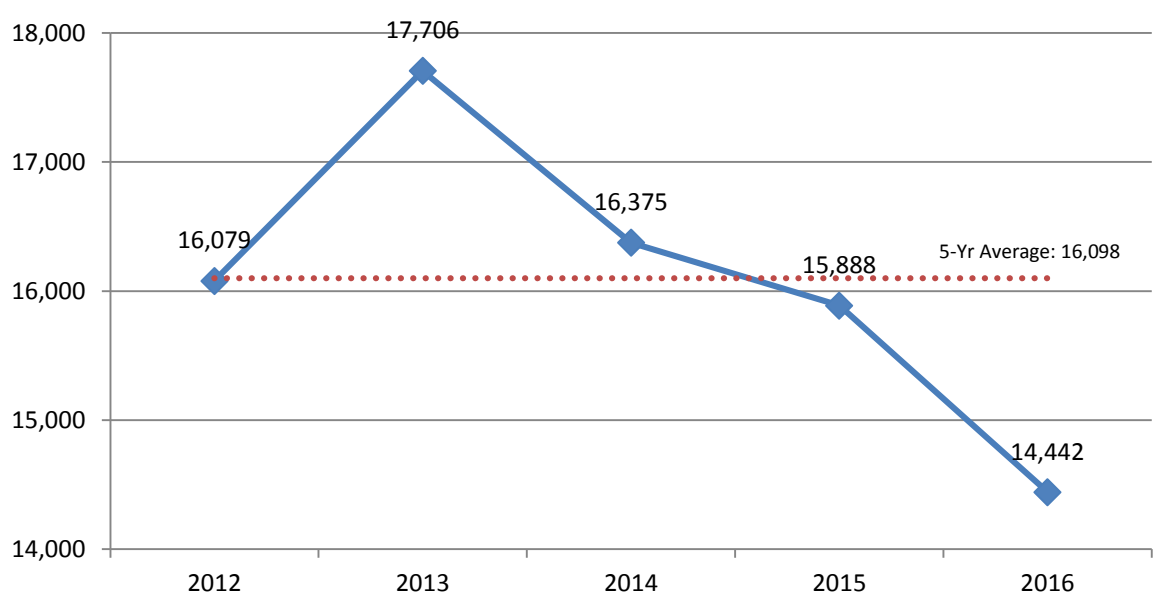
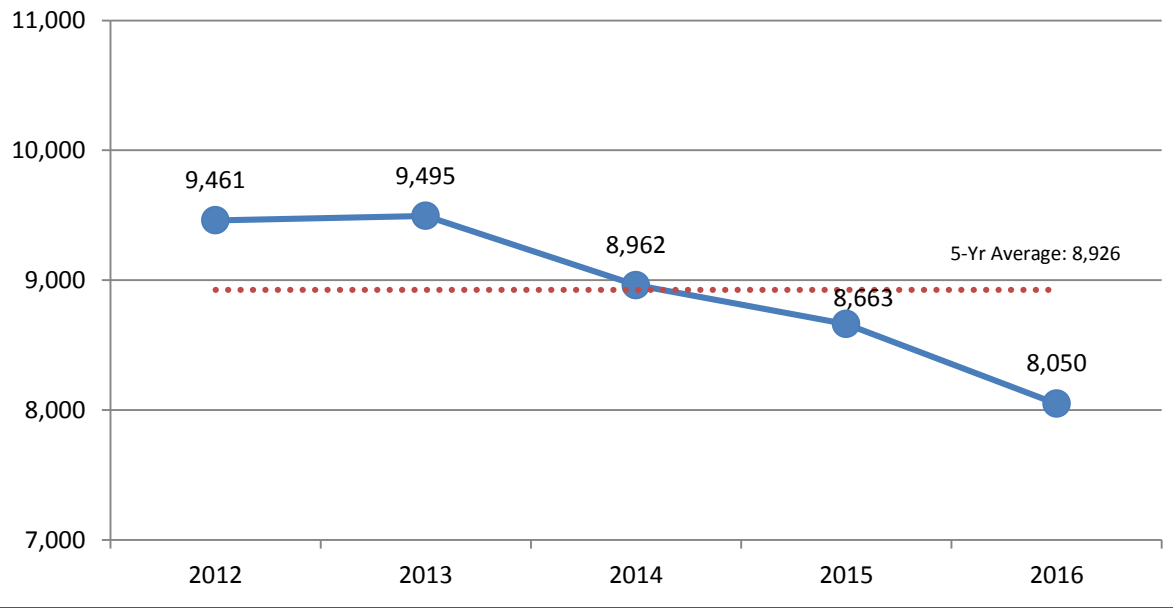


Figure 2.0-Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Enrollment at Joliet Junior College Spring Census 2012-2016

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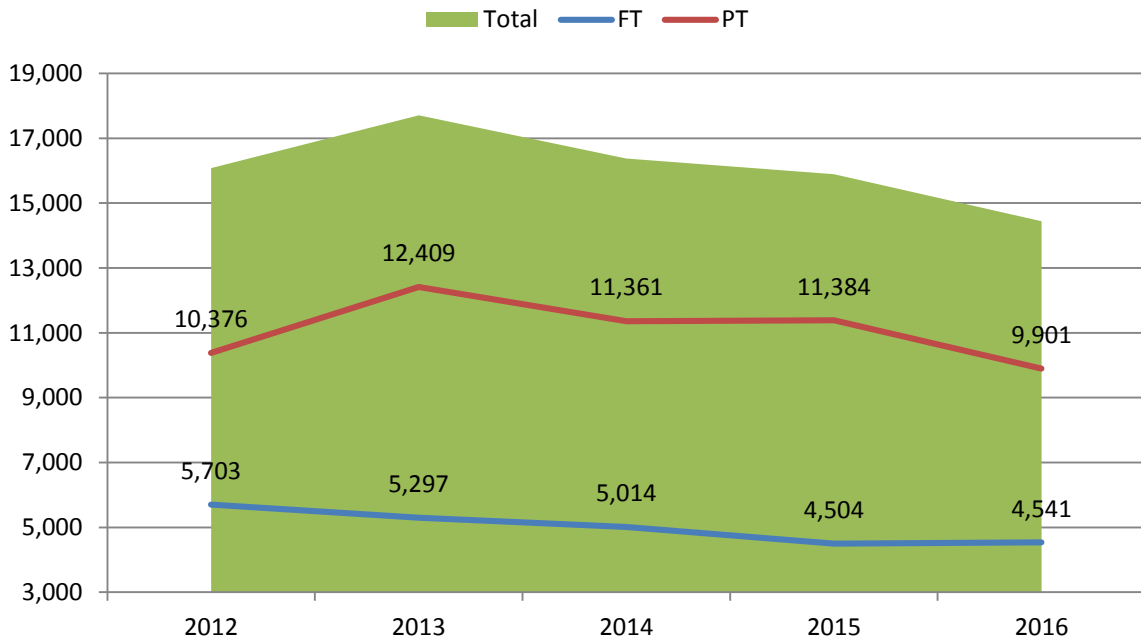
Enrollment by Full-Time/Part-Time Status

Part-time students represent over sixty-eight percent (68.5%) of the Spring 2016 census headcount, this is a headcount decrease of 1,483 (-13.0% part-time students) from Spring 2015. JJC witnessed a slight increase of +0.8% in number of full-time students for Spring 2016 (+37 full-time students).

Figure 3.0 represents the breakouts by full and part-time students over the most recent 5 Spring census dates.

Enrollment by Gender and Race/Ethnicity

The number of female credit students has decreased by 7.8% (-673 females) from the previous Spring term census. Females made up 54.7% of the Spring 2016 census headcount. Fewer males have also enrolled for Spring 2016 down 10.6% (-773 students). Figure 4.0 below represents the enrollment trends over the 5 most recent Spring terms.

During the Spring 2016 census Black Non-Hispanic students witnessed a decrease of 6.0% (-93 students) from the previous Spring census. The Hispanic population witnessed a 0.9% increase for Spring 2016 (+31 students), and the White Non-Hispanic student population decreased by 13.0% (-1,265 students) over the prior Spring census. The total minority population for the Spring 2016 census is 5,664 representing a 2.1% decrease to the prior year’s total. *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.* Table 1.0 below represents the change in headcount by race/ethnicity over the 5 most recent spring terms. Overall the minority population represents 39.2% of the total census headcount for Spring 2016 at JJC. Figure 5.0 on the following page represents the minority enrollment population as a percent of the overall student population on Spring census.

Figure 4.0-Headcount Enrollment Gender Spring Census 2012-2016

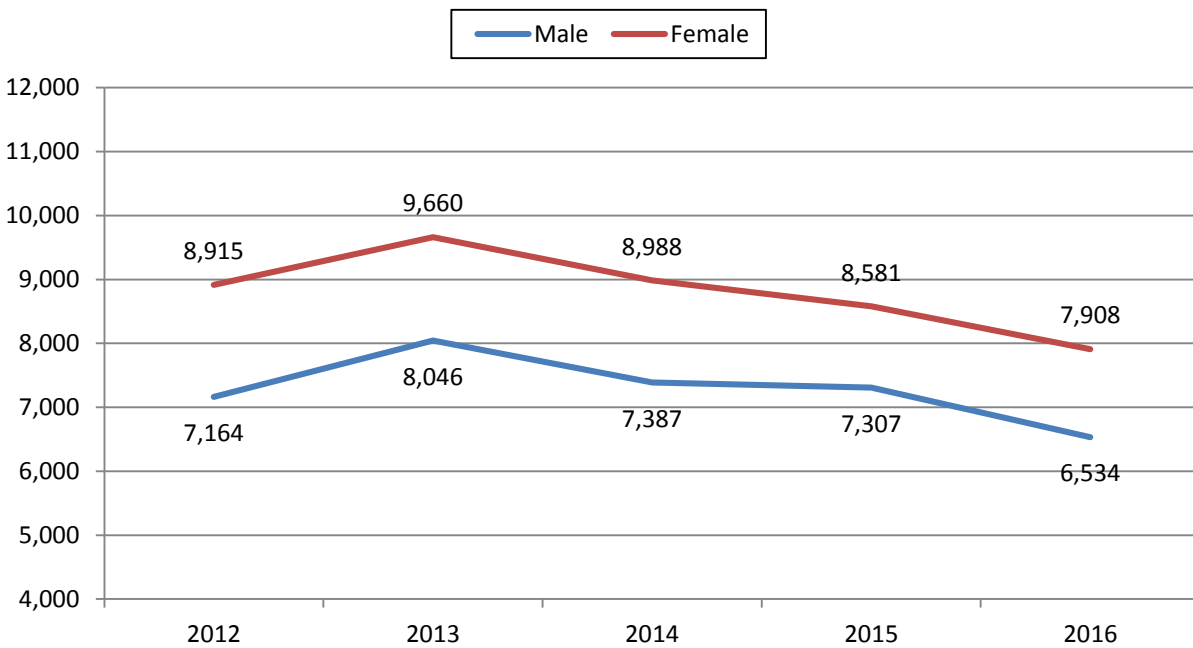
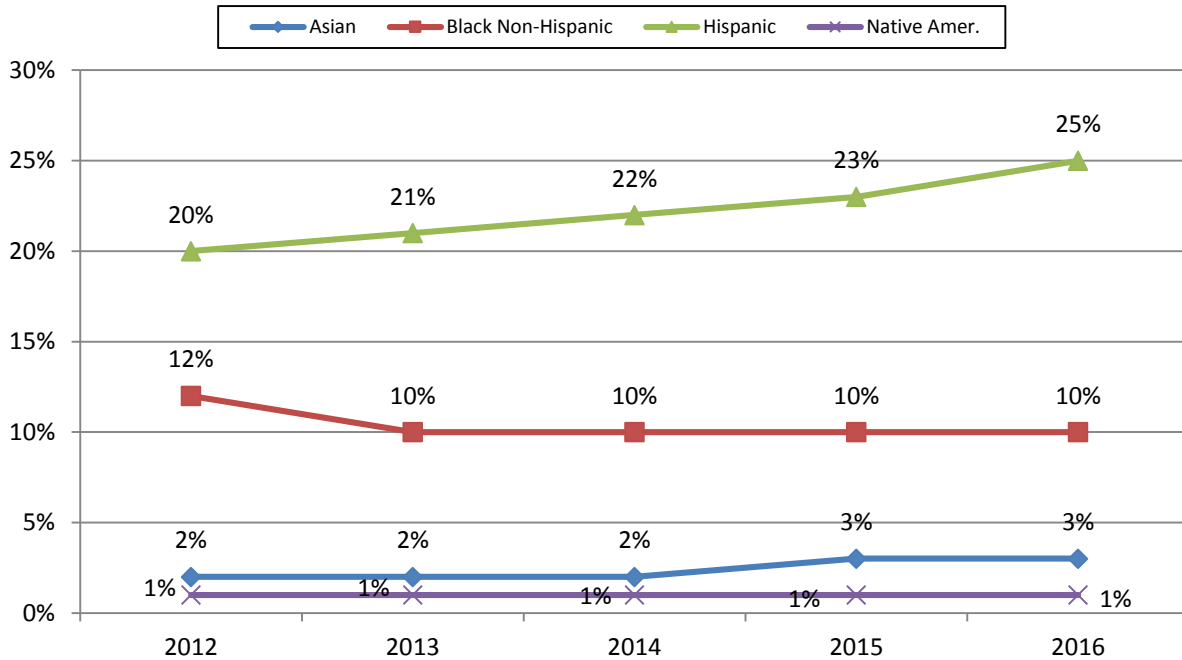
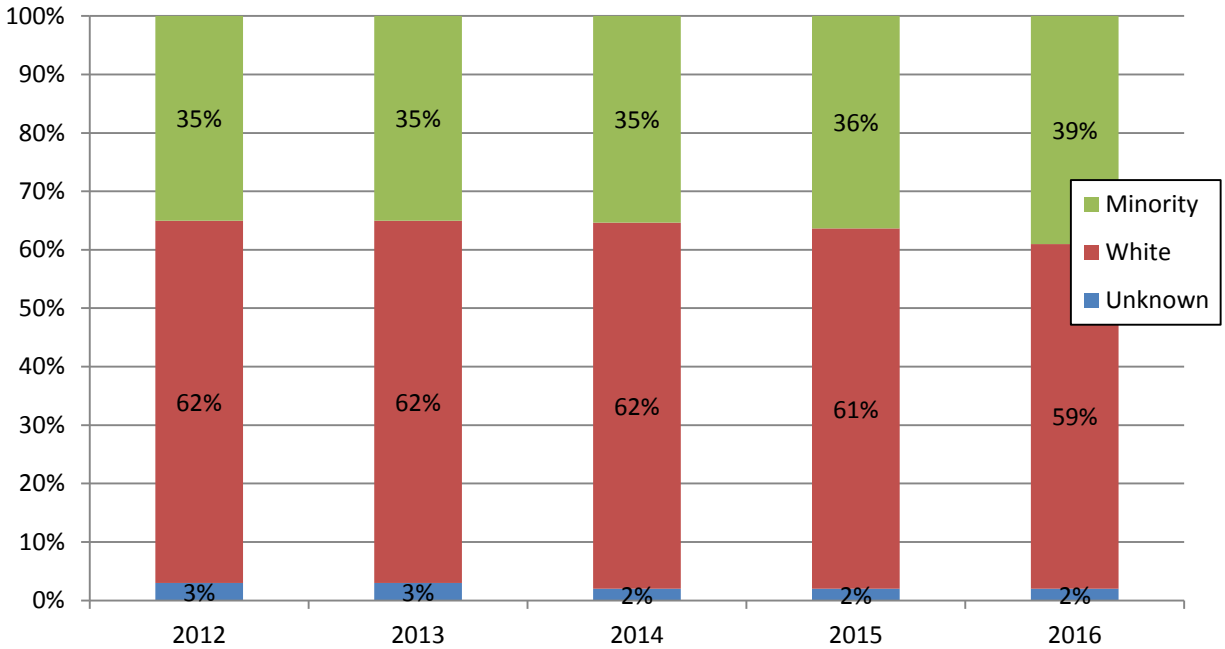

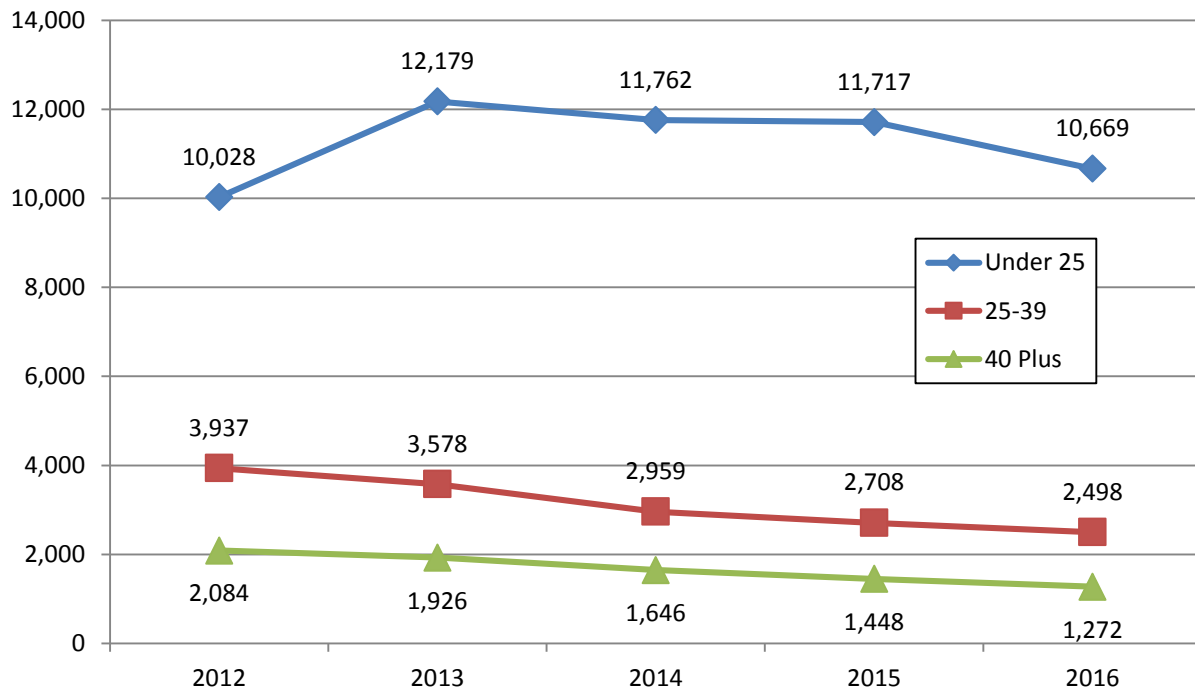
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Enrollment by Age Category

Just over twenty-six percent (26.1%) of the Spring 2016 credit students are 25 years of age or older representing an 8.9% decrease in the number on the 2015 Spring census for the 25 and older population. The largest number change is represented by the “17-20” age category with a decrease of 653 students (-8.0%). *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.* Figure 6.0 below represents the headcount enrollment by age category.

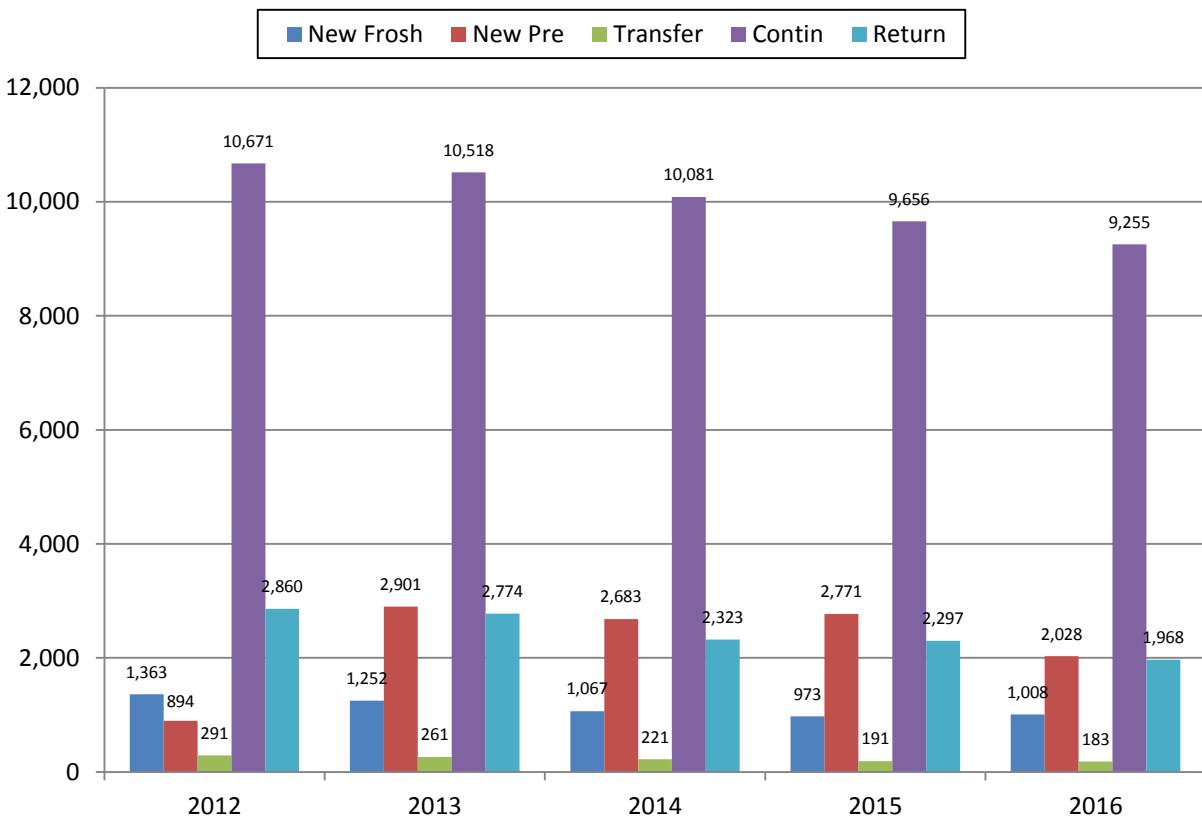
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Enrollment by Registration Status

The number of continuing students has decreased by 401 students (-4.2%) from the previous Spring term. JJC has witnessed a 14.3% decrease to the number of returning students (-329). An increase of 3.6% (+35) was witnessed to new freshman. New Pre-College students witnessed a 26.8% decrease from the prior year's census (-743 students). Transfer students decreased by 8 students representing a 4.2% decline. Data definitions: New Freshman – a student not previously enrolled in college; New Pre-College – includes early entry, dual credit; Transfer – a student entering JJC having earned credit at another college/university; Continuing – a student who has enrolled at JJC the previous term; Returning – a student who has enrolled at JJC previously but not in the previous term. *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.*

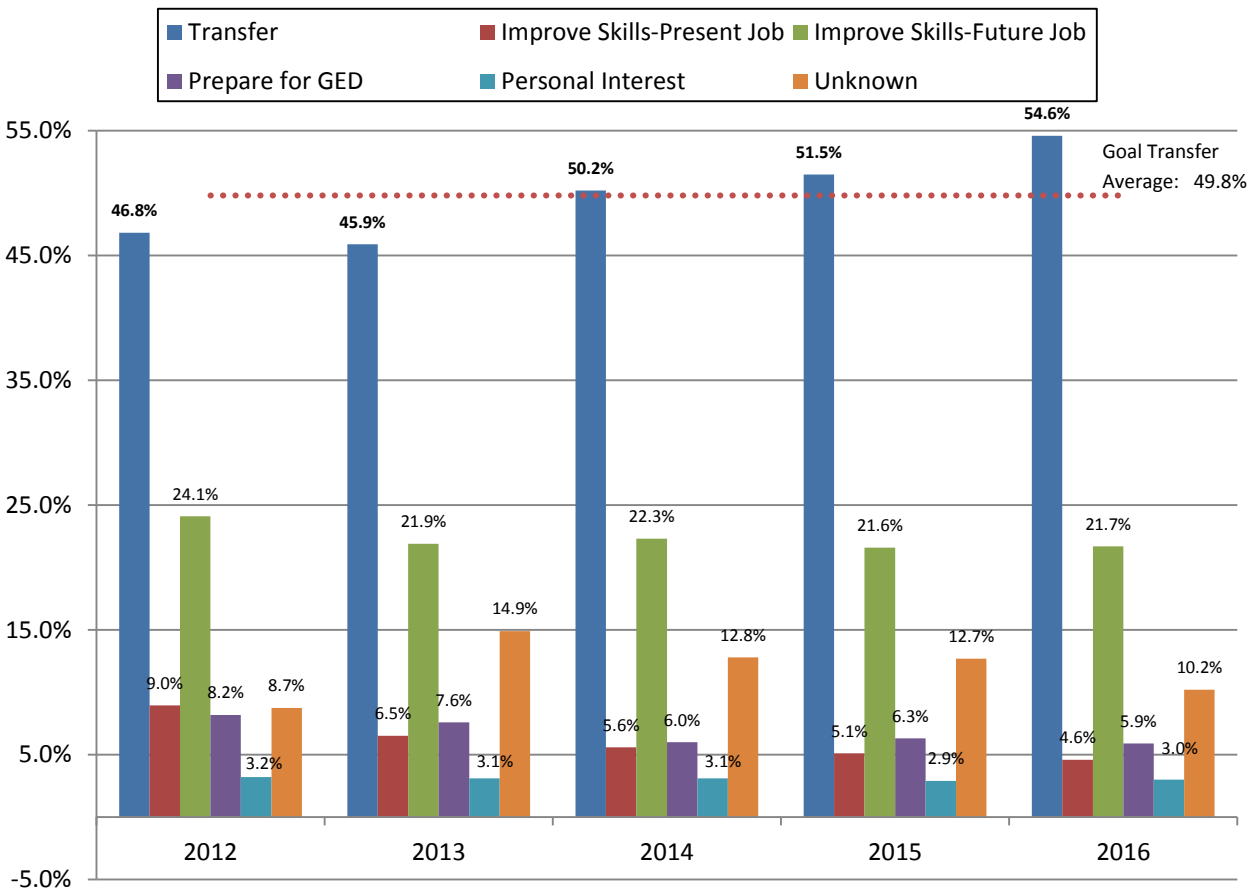
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Enrollment by Intent (Goal) and Certificate/Degree Objective

The following figure represents the primary intent (goal) of the student as of the current Spring census. More than fifty-four percent (54.6%) of students indicated they intend to transfer. Figure 8.0 also reflects the headcount and percent breakdowns by intent (goal) categories. Figure 9.0 on the following page represents the students' certificate and degree objective for attending JJC. On average just under sixty-six (66.3%) of enrollees objective is to complete an Associate Degree.

Figure 8.0-Headcount Enrollment by Intent (Goal) Spring Census 2012-2016

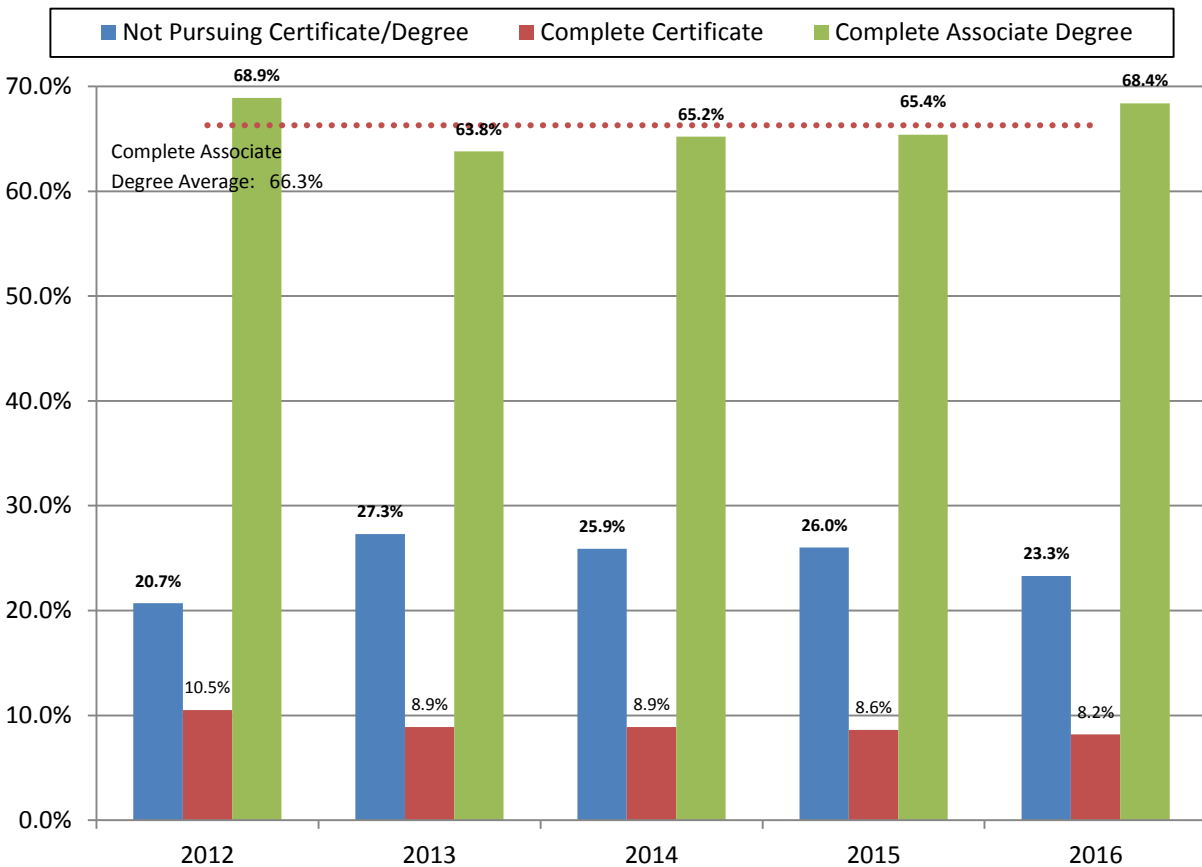

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Enrollment by Top 25 Cities

Although Joliet continues to have the highest proportion of students for Spring 2016 (21.7% of total Spring 2016 census) enrollees declined by 266 (-7.8%) from the previous census.
