Students should ideally apply for admission to Lewis their first semester at JJC in order to receive appropriate advising and maximize their semesters at JJC. Candidates must have a GPA of at least 2.75 prior to full admission to a College of Education Teacher preparation program. Grade of "C" or higher is required in all Professional Education coursework at JJC and Lewis University.



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\*This transfer guide is a sample curriculum. Additional courses may be required based on placement test scores. Please work with your faculty advisor or success coach prior to course registration.

\*\*Courses are to be chosen in consultation with an academic advisor. Students will be required to complete 128 credit hours for the Bachelor of Arts in Early Childhood Special Education degree. Graduates of JJC must complete a minimum of 59 credit hours from Lewis to be awarded the Bachelor of Arts in Early Childhood Special Education degree. All other program requirements apply.
