Students should ideally apply for admission to USF their first semester at JJC in order to receive appropriate advising and maximize their semesters at JJC. Students who transfer from JJC to USF and have earned an A.A.S. Human Services degree must complete the curriculum as agreed to by both schools with a 2.5 cumulative GPA or higher.

USF's Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) program is designed for those who wish to make a career out of helping people improve their lives and reach their highest potential. Our program helps students develop skills that will give them the competency they need to be marketable and to make a difference in today's multicultural world.
