Graduates of JJC must complete a minimum of 32 credit hours from Lewis to be awarded the Bachelor of Arts in Social Work degree. All other program requirements apply.

During the program, social work majors will learn to recognize the value of human relationships, think critically and understand research in practice. Upon graduation, they will be qualified to apply for social work licensure in the State of Illinois.
