

CONNECTING WITH YOUR TRANSFER SCHOOLS: A GUIDE



You may want to connect with different transfer institutions, but where do you start? Who should you talk to and how do you find them? What questions do you ask during the meeting? This guide will give you a few tips!

Where Do I Start?

- Try to narrow down a major, program, or career you may be interested in learning more about.
- If you're completely undecided, that's normal! You can still think about transferring!
- Try to narrow down a few transfer schools you may be interested in. Do you want to be close to home, a few hours away, or out of state? Would you feel comfortable in a school with a large student population or would you like to be in a smaller setting?

You may not have the answer to these questions right now, and that's okay! It may take some time and research before you find the right fit.

Who Do I Talk To?

- Talk to admission representatives from potential transfer schools. Admissions reps are college and university employees who will answer your questions and help you through the transfer process.
- Admissions reps are available to meet with you through several online options! Our [transfer website](#) has a schedule of colleges and university virtual visits throughout the semester. You will also find the virtual meeting links there. You may have to make an appointment or simply click the provided link to drop-in during the scheduled meeting time. **They want to talk to you!**
- JJC is offering virtual transfer fairs, giving you an opportunity to connect with several schools in the same visit. Again, you can visit the [transfer website](#) for fair dates and meeting links.

What Do I Ask?

Here are a few questions to start the conversation with the admissions rep. You may have many others! Ask any questions that are important to you.

- Do you have the program in which I am interested? What similar majors do you have?
- What are your admission requirements?
- What are the application deadlines?
- Are your classes online or in-person? Can an entire degree be completed online?
- Are you currently giving in-person or virtual campus visits?
- What academic support resources do you offer?
- Are there courses I need to complete prior to transfer?
- How would I go about having my credits evaluated?
- What is the typical class size at your institution?
- What is the financial aid process at your school?
- What is the tuition at your school? What types of fees do you charge?
- Are there any scholarships available for transfer students?
- What is campus life like at your institution? Is it easy to get involved?
