**This transfer guide is a sample curriculum. Additional courses may be required based on placement test scores. Please work with your faculty advisor or success coach prior to course registration.

Notes:

Once a student entering the RN/BS programs provides evidence of a current unencumbered RN license, the School of Nursing will complete an overall assessment of the student's work experience and the previously completed community college and university nursing coursework. The School of Nursing may then grant up to 40-43 proficiency credits to provide the student with advanced standing in the nursing program. These credits differ from the transfer of courses. If the student's college/university credits are greater than 5 years old, the candidate will need to submit a portfolio to demonstrate proficiency in the areas in which credit is sought along with evidence of a current unencumbered RN license.

About SIUE Program:

The SIUE School of Nursing offers dynamic programs of undergraduate study that are both theoretical and practical, designed to meet current and future challenges of nursing. Embedded in liberal arts courses, our students receive a well-rounded education guided by their personal faculty mentor. Once admitted into the nursing program, students are guaranteed clinical placements in agencies through the metro St. Louis area. The School of Nursing welcomes qualified applicants from other colleges and universities. Selected nursing courses will transfer only from National League for Nursing Accreditation Commission or Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education accredited baccalaureate programs with approval of the Student Affairs Committee of the School of Nursing. About JJC's Program:

The nursing program of Joliet Junior College has a rich history, with the first nursing class of 11 having graduated in 1971. Today, more than 100 students graduate from both the practical nurse program and the registered nurse program annually. Our students have the benefit of a state-of-the-art simulation center in the Health Professions Center. High-fidelity simulation enhances our students' education and adds to the realism of the learning experience. The 2019 figures from the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) show the rates for candidates who have completed the registered nurse (RN) and licensed practical nurse (LPN) tests for the past five years. It is based on their completion of the licensure examinations for the first time upon graduating from an Illinois-approved nursing education program.

JJC's first-time pass rate in 2020 for the NCLEX-RN was **96%**. That's well above the national average of 87%. JJC had the second-most graduates in the state from an associate degree program.

As for the NCLEX-PN, JJC's first-time pass rate in 2020 was **100%**. By comparison, the national rate was 83%.
